



Frequently Asked Questions About Our New Schools

Unnamed Stouffville French Immersion Elementary School

How do I register my child (Grade 1 to Grade 8 French Immersion)?

French Immersion Students Currently Attending Harry Bowes Public School or Glad Park Public School

- French Immersion students currently attending either Harry Bowes Public School (Grade 1-3) or Glad Park Public School (Grade 4-8) **are not** required to register again as they will be automatically electronically transferred to the new French Immersion school.

York Region District School Board Senior Kindergarten Students Registering for Grade 1 French Immersion

- Email or call their home school office (where your child currently attends) and declare their intention to register in French Immersion for the 2025-26 school year.

New to York Region District School Board

- Registration for new French Immersion students to the community, will be accepted with the required documentation at either Harry Bowes Public School (Grade 1-3) or Glad Park Public School (Grade 4-8) for the new school opening in September 2025.

Will my child be able to remain at their current school?

The French Immersion program currently operating at Harry Bowes Public School (Grade 1-3) and Glad Park Public School (Grade 4-8) will be moving to the new Unnamed Stouffville Elementary School. Neither Harry Bowes Public School or Glad Park Public School will operate a French Immersion program for the 2025-26 school year.

Will the new school have a Before and After School program (B/A program)?

Is busing available?

Busing will be available to eligible students. As per Board Policy #680, Transportation to Schools:

- Grade 1-3 students who live more than 1.2 kilometers from the school are eligible for transportation.
- Grade 4-8 students who live more than 1.6 kilometers from the school are eligible for transportation.
- Pick up and drop off times are times determined by Student Transportation Services. Information about busing pick up points is available late August at www.schoolbuscity.com.
