

WET AND DRY CLOTHES

In the warmer weather, footwear should allow students to participate in all school activities safely.




EQAO for 2021-22

Class Placement Input Form

In the upcoming months, our teaching staff will begin organizing classes for September 2022. A great deal of time, consideration and staff collaboration goes into placing students in balanced and positive learning environments.

The staff at Adrienne Clarkson PS has a very strong understanding of our students and is extremely caring and professional about the class placement process. Homeroom teachers, appropriate support staff and school administration devote much discussion time to the generation of classes that strive to best meet the needs of all of our students. Class placement is a complex process that takes many hours of thought and discussion.

Classes at each grade level are formed using a variety of important criteria such as:

- · Class size consistent with Board and Ministry guidelines;
- · Gender balance in each class;
- · A range of performance levels within each class, taking into account the skills,knowledge, attitudes and work habits of individual students;
 - . Learning styles, learning partners and social factors (promoting positive social relationships while minimizing unproductive associations).

While friendship issues can play a role in the comfort level of some students, at particular developmental stages some friends learn best in separate classes.

Please note that combined grade classes (split classes) may be part of our organization for the upcoming school year.

As partners in education, we value the input of families. If you do feel there are considerations about your child's learning style or peer associations that are important to be taken into consideration, please complete the form below and return to the school to the attention of the Principal, Nadia Russiello **or** you can complete the form at this link https://forms.gle/TZT8MzgErkDnQwW17 by **May 18th.**

Parent input that is received *in writing* by administration *by May 18, 2022* will be <u>considered</u> (and shared) during placement meetings. **Please avoid naming a teacher** as staffing can vary. If you do include the name of a specific teacher, your request will

be returned to you. *Input after May 18th will not* be considered due to the complexity of the task.

Please be advised that while such input is valued it cannot drive class placement decisions since school-wide limitations and a variety of other factors will, at times, take precedence.

Final decisions regarding student placements remain the responsibility of the Principal and the school staff. Since Ministry mandates on class size will impact class placements and staffing can change throughout the summer months, class placement information will be shared with families on the first day of school.

As always, we appreciate your understanding as we work together for the benefit of all our students.

SCHOOL COMMUNITY COVID-19 VACCINE CLINICS

Dear parent or guardian,

Thank you for your ongoing support and partnership to help keep our schools open and as safe as possible for in-person learning.

We are pleased to announce that we have organized community school-based clinics for York Region students, families and the public at various schools across York Region. Please visit the clinic closest to you, listed in the chart in this letter.

First, second and booster doses will be available at these clinics. The pediatric Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine will be offered to children aged five to 11 and the adolescent/adult Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for anyone aged 12 and older. Both Pfizer and Moderna will be available for adults aged 30 years and older.

Every effort will be made to make the vaccination process as comfortable as possible for children and their families. Children are welcome to bring their favourite teddy bear or stuffed toy and/or other comfort item (e.g., iPad, tablet, handheld toy).

Individuals ages five to 11 require a parent or legal guardian to provide <u>consent</u> at the time of vaccination. If a parent or legal guardian is unable to accompany their child to the appointment they can complete and sign a consent form and send it with their child.
