Winter Weather & Recess

Students should come dressed appropriately for the weather and for outdoor play. Students can stay warm by wearing layers of loose-fitting clothing, a hat, scarf, jackets, snow pants and mittens or gloves. Students may also want to bring extra pants and socks in case they get wet.

If students are well enough to come to school, they are expected to go outside for recess. Our students benefit from spending time outside and being active. We monitor weather conditions throughout the day. If there are extreme weather conditions, we may consider a shortened or indoor recess.

<u>Health Connections</u> Social-Emotional Learning for Children

What we choose to say, how we say it and even how we play with words and language – create the kind of pleasant and welcoming environment that makes family dinner worthwhile. Here are some tips for choosing and using words for fun and conversation that will make everyone want seconds.

- 1. Food Poetry take a bite of food and have your child give the most descriptive words that come to mind think about texture, taste, smell, etc.
- Story by Sentence one family member begins a story and talks for no more than a minute. The story then moves on to the next family member, who continues the story. Some ground rules: Story themes must be about choices people make, everyone participates, no one goes for too long.

Message from Our Trustee

As we enter another month of winter, this is a good time to be thinking about our health, well-being and the importance of self-care. We know that, like all of us, our students can focus better when they feel better. Our schools play an important role in health and mental health promotion and education, and fostering well-being and mental health is one of our <u>priorities as a school board</u>.

There is a lot of work taking place in our schools and board to create <u>healthy schools</u> and promote mental health and well-being, including:

- Providing training and resources for educators on strategies to support mentally healthy classrooms for all students, including holding a mental health conference.
- Hiring identity specific mental health workers and developing partnerships with community partners to serve the diverse needs of our students.
- Developing a <u>Student Suicide Intervention Protocol</u> to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions.
- Educating students about the risks of <u>substance use and misuse</u>, including <u>vaping</u> and <u>cannabis</u>.
- Providing strategies and supports for students in <u>preparing for exams</u> and <u>managing stress</u>.

This commitment is also reflected in Board policy like the <u>Healthy Schools and Workplaces</u> policy and procedures. Setting policy, which governs the operation of the Board, is one of the <u>roles of trustees</u>, and we greatly value the input provided by students, staff members, family and community members. I encourage you to look at the <u>policies under review</u> and share your feedback.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2020. At the Board meeting in December, trustees unanimously approved the addition of new permanent Indigenous Trustee and Indigenous Student Trustee positions. We are committed to Indigenous Education in our Board and it is important that these voices are represented at the table. We hope to fill the positions as soon as possible and will share more information as it becomes available.

BUS AND SCHOOL CANCELLATIONS

You must **notify** the **school** if your child will be **absent** due to **bus cancellations**.

BUSES

If buses have been cancelled in the morning, there *will not* be afternoon bussing. Please see below for bussing information.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Students who come to school when busses are cancelled may be dropped off through the parking lot loop in the morning.

Pick up will begin at 2:00 pm. You must come into the school to pick up your child. Please pick up your child by 2:35 pm.

When an extreme cold or inclement weather day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) is cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. Please notify the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when emergency weather events occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure. Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, <u>Board</u> and school website and on <u>twitter @YRDSB</u>.

Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather and emergency weather days are outlined in the Board's <u>Severe Weather policy</u>, which has been recently updated and is available for public comment. Seeking feedback from staff and community members, including parents/guardians, is an important part of the review process. All <u>policies available for comment</u> are sent to school council chairs and are posted on the Board website, along with information about how to provide feedback.

Safe Pickup and Drop Off
