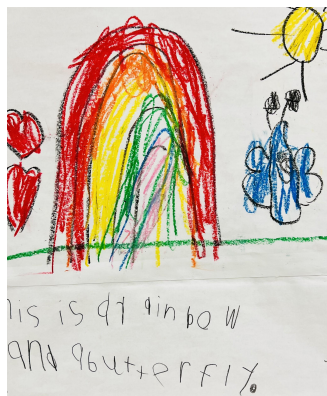
Message from the Office

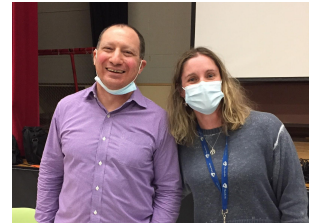

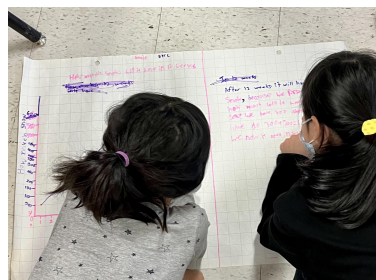

Passover

What is Passover?

Passover is a holiday or a festival celebrated by the Jewish community. It is a religious holiday. The special meal Seder includes drinking wine and people reciting special blessings or prayers.

Why do people celebrate passover?

God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and people now celebrate it. Passover takes place during the Spring time and can last seven to eight days.

Did you know?

During Passover, Jews do not eat bread (which has to rise) instead they eat matzo (flat cracker). This is symbolic because matzo does not need to rise, and when they were escaping from slavery the bread did not have time to rise.

Vaisakhi, also pronounced Baisakhi, is a spring festival celebrated on the 13 or 14 of April every year. This year it is taking place on April 14. On Vaisakhi, Sikhs go to the Gurdwaras in the morning for a service. Afterwards they sing, chant, and wear colourful clothing. In the evening, Sikhs have a special meal with family and friends.

Health Protocol Highlights - Effective March 21st, 2022

As you may be aware, the [Government of Ontario](#) announced their plan to lift many of the COVID-19 health and safety measures in public spaces and schools. Please see the Updated recommendation messaged to families April 13, 2022

“The province of Ontario is currently experiencing a sixth wave of COVID-19 due to the high transmissibility of the Omicron BA.2 variant. **As a result, York Region Public Health, along with York Region District School Board (YRDSB) and York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB) are strongly recommending all students, teachers, staff and visitors wear a mask in school when they return to school on Tuesday, April 19, 2022.** We will continue to closely monitor our trends in York Region and will communicate any further changes to this recommendation. This advice is aligned with statements made by Ontario’s Chief Medical Officer of Health on April 11, 2022

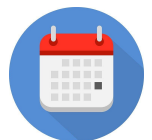

Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration for September 2022 begins January 14 for the 2022-23 school year. Children who were born in 2018, live within the school boundary and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

- **Online** - Families can access online Edsby by following Kindergarten registration information at www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.
- **By email** - Families can download the [Elementary School Registration Form](#) at www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten and email the completed form to their school email address Aldergrove.ps@yrdsb.ca .
- **By phone** - Families can request support from the school office to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. School contact number (905) 470-2227
- **By mail or appointment.** You can mail completed applications to the school, or request an appointment to drop-off your completed paper application form. Families are asked to follow all school COVID-19 protocols while on site. All permitted visitors must wear a mask.

Please note, at this time, under our [health and safety protocols](#), we cannot accept walk-in registrations. Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the [required documents](#).

- 25 years of Black Youth Helpline (BYH) experience has proved informing. We must Intervene on behalf of youth with complex needs before severe problems arise.
- Needed are primary prevention approaches including a focus on parents and schools at the earliest possible point.
- A significant body of literature underline that suspensions and dismissals from schools are 3-4 times higher for vulnerable children.
- The word "drop-out" is often a misnomer. Repeated suspensions and dismissals fuel school failure and push students out of schools (Wilson, 2014). "We need to comprehend fully why schools fail some youths and conversely, why some students are failing school" (Dei, 1996).
- By helping youth, parents and schools succeed we increase the chances for productive futures for Canada's children.
