Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration for September 2023 begins January 20 for the 2023-24 school year. Children who were born in 2019, live within the school boundary, and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

- **Online** - Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.
- **By email** - Families can download the [Elementary School Registration Form](#) at www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten and email the completed form to school email address aldergrove.ps@yrdsb.ca
- **By phone** - Families can request support to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation. [Call your local school](#). (905) 470-2227
- **In-person at the school** - Families may visit the school office to drop off or complete a registration form.

Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the [required documents](#).

Anti-Black Racism

Our priority of championing equity and inclusivity has a focus on creating Black affirming learning environments that prioritize the well-being of Black students and are free from anti-Black racism, harassment, and discrimination.

In response to continued evidence of anti-Black racism in Canadian institutions, including in education, the Board co-developed an anti-Black racism strategy, launched in 2021. The [Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy: Creating anti-racist and Black-affirming learning and working environments](#) was co-developed by York Region Black community leaders, YRDSB staff and in consultation with students. The launch of the strategy marks a coordinated effort to address anti-Black racism at the Board.

The systemic nature of anti-Black racism requires that school boards act proactively to support equitable access to quality education and opportunities for all students and to challenge the marginalization of Black students, staff and families.

The Centre for Black Student Excellence is a space committed to the promotion of Dismantling Anti-Black racism and amplifying voices that have been historically marginalized. The Centre includes a new central hub of information on the Board website available at www.yrdsb.ca/blackexcellence.

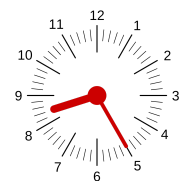


The Snow Show

Tamil Heritage Month

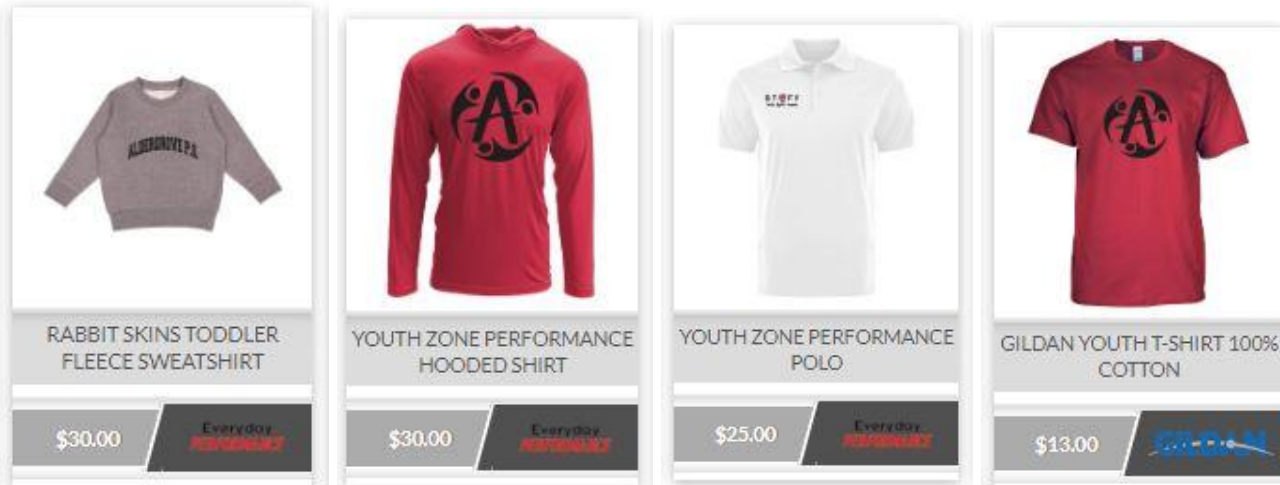

2023 Camper Application Information

What is Arts Camp?

Celebrating over 30 years on the shores of a private lake in the Haliburton Highlands, Camp White Pine is host to a unique yearly camp for Grades 7-12 York Region District School Board students. Arts Camp is an intensive week-long immersion in visual, studio and performance art programs and experiences. At camp, each camper is encouraged to discover and explore their identity through supported risk-taking and positive collaboration with peers, staff artists and camp leaders through intensive and extended opportunities to explore and discover new and creative talents. Arts Camp fosters rich opportunities to gain self-awareness, self-confidence and a distinct identity, while supporting the growth, individuality and potential of all participants.

Camper Application Information

When is it?

May 27th to June 3rd, 2023

Where is it held?

Camp White Pine, Haliburton, ON
(Optional transportation is offered for a fee.)

Who can apply?

Students in Grades 7 – 12 who are registered in a York Region District School Board school. There is no limit to the number of student applications submitted from an individual school provided that each student applicant has met the following criteria:

- Student demonstrates positive character in the school;
- Student does not show significant behavioural concerns in the school;
- Student would positively contribute to and benefit from an arts program in an inclusive community;
- Student is prepared, mature and well enough to spend a week away from home and school;
- Student has parental/guardian consent; and
- Student has their school administrator's support and the endorsement of a teacher at the school.

For Elementary Students:

Up to 130 students are randomly selected from each elementary school that applies, with the intention to have a gender balance of campers.

For Secondary Students:

First time applicants will be given priority to attend. Secondary students can apply for additional years at camp, and will be accepted only after first time applicants have been considered. Students are selected through a random lottery process.

How do I apply?

Carefully review the information in this package and then use the provided link (at the end) to access the 2023 Camper Application Form. Applications will be accepted starting Thursday, January 19th, 2023

What is the deadline for applying?

Friday, February 17th, 2023. Late applications will not be accepted.

How long will it take to complete the application?

Completing the required fields will take approximately 15-20 minutes. The application form must be completed in one sitting as there is no option to save and return to your application.

How do I apply for a Leadership (Counsellor or Counsellor-in-Training) Position?

The Counsellor application process is now closed and the CIT application process is open until January 27th, 2023. This process is now complete and all Counsellors and Counsellors-in-Training have been selected. CIT applicants are strongly encouraged to complete a Camper application if they wish to be selected as a Camper if no CIT positions are available.

What else do I need to know about applying?

Applications must be completed in their entirety in one session. There is no option to save and return to your application.

Your application does not guarantee acceptance into the program. All complete applications will be considered during the phased lottery selection system. *The confirmation email you receive after applying is not an acceptance to the program; it is a confirmation of your application only.*

Offers of acceptance will be emailed to families (using the address provided in the online application form) by mid-March. Please take care to enter the email address correctly. Please note: It is not advisable to use a Hotmail, Outlook, YAHOO or LIVE email account as the Board experiences regular delivery issues with these providers. Gmail accounts are recommended. 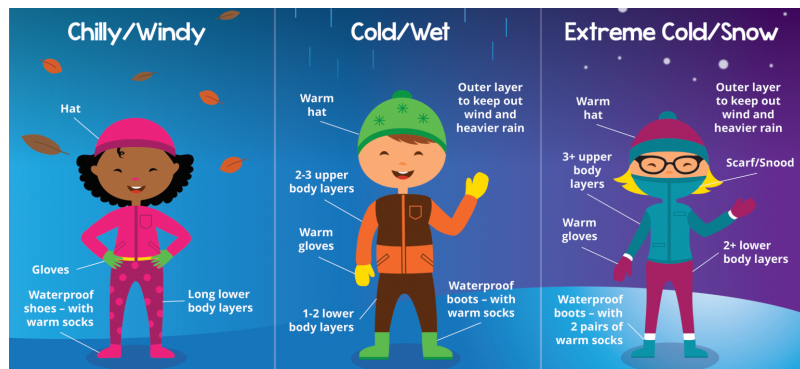

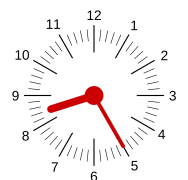


雪花秀

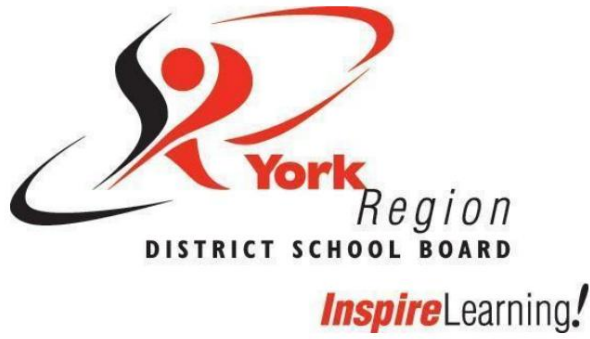
