YRDSB Family Dashboard

YRDSB is excited to launch our new **Family Dashboard**. The dashboard will give you secure one-stop access to information and applications related to your child's education. It is designed to make it easier for families to engage with their child's education. In this first phase, the dashboard will include secure access to report cards when they are distributed and links to useful information for parents/guardians.

Important notes before setting up your account:

- If you wish to use a different email, please contact the school to update your email on file before creating your account. YRDSB email addresses (@[yrdsb.ca](#), @[gappps.yrdsb.ca](#)) will not be accepted.
- Each account must have a unique email address, if you have a shared family address that is being used by more than one contact, you will only be able to set up one account. If you would like to set up individual accounts for access, one of the contacts will need to contact the school and update their email address on file with the school.
- As long as your email on file is the same for all your children, when you sign in to the Family Dashboard, you should see all of your children.
- Passwords are required to be a minimum of eight characters and a maximum of 256 characters. Requires three out of four of the following types of characters: lowercase characters; uppercase characters, numbers (0-9); symbols..
- Display Name refers to the parent/guardian who is creating the account. This does not have to match the name in our system.
- If you are not sure of your child's student number, it is your child's student login for Google Classroom.
- You only need information for one student to create your account. Once created, as long as your email on file is the same for all your children, when you sign in to the Family Dashboard, you should see all of your children.
- Once you have set up your account, you can access the dashboard using [family.yrdsb.ca](#)

or under [Family Resources](#), which can be found on the homepage from the Board website or school websites.

- If you forget your password – from the login screen, select the forgot password in order to create a new password.

Setting up your account

- Visit family.yrdsb.ca to set up your account.
- Click “No account? Create one” under the email.
- Enter this email address into the email field and click the Next Button.
- Check your email, you will receive an email with a one-time code that expires within 30 minutes in order to confirm your identity.
- Return to the account creation screen and enter this code.
- Once your email has been validated you will be asked to create a password, enter a Display Name (parent/guardian name) and enter the following information about your child or one of your children for further verification:
 - Student Number
 - Student Birthdate
 - Student Home Address Postal Code

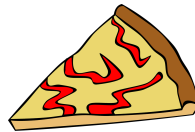

Treaties Recognition Week

“Today, some Canadians see treaties as artifacts of another era in their history, with no current relevance. First Nations people view treaties as “living” agreements that respect their status as nations, as recognized in the Royal Proclamation of 1763. They see this as their “inherent right” referred to in Section 35 of the Canadian Constitution.” (Maurice Switzer, “We are all...Treaty People” p.34)

Treaties Recognition Week is November 3-9, 2024. First Nations were the original occupants of this land we call Ontario. The British Crown (government) and First Nations negotiated and signed treaties with the intent of delivering mutual benefits. First Nations signed as independent, self-governing nations. Despite the promise of early treaties and the mutually respectful partnerships they established, Indigenous peoples were targeted by colonial policies designed to exploit, assimilate, and eradicate them.

Today, the Ontario Government is working to rebuild trust and relationships with treaty partners and Indigenous peoples. Part of that effort includes [educating Ontarians](#) about the role treaties play in our lives and relationships with each other today.

Canada is moving forward with Indigenous partners to advance Indigenous rights through negotiations across Canada. To learn more about negotiations in progress please visit the [Government of Canada site](#).

During the week of November 3-9, 2024, we recognize the importance of treaties and bring awareness to the treaty relationships between First Nations, Métis and Inuit and non-Indigenous people throughout the province. There are 46 treaties in Ontario, and we all have a responsibility to recognize, learn about and honour these treaties.

November is Hindu Heritage Month

November is Hindu Heritage Month. On December 8, 2016, the province of Ontario designated November as Hindu Heritage Month as outlined in the [Hindu Heritage Month Act](#). November 2022 marked Canada's first official Hindu Heritage month. During this month, YRDSB recognizes and celebrates the past, present and future contributions and inspirational impact of Hindu Canadians in our communities.

Hinduism is considered by some as one of the world's oldest religions, dating back over 10,000 years. With over 900 million followers worldwide, Hinduism is the third-largest religion. Hinduism is a henotheistic religion that worships one God while acknowledging the existence of other gods. Some of these deities include Brahma, Shiva, Paarvathi, Lakshmi, Ganesha, Muruga, Kaali, and Vishnu, along with others. Hinduism consists of many traditions and festivities that are celebrated throughout the year. Diwali, Navaratri, and Ganesh Chaturthi are some celebrations in which Hindus participate in Ontario, Canada, and around the world. For Hindu Canadians, faith-based practices vary across communities, cultures and generations of people.



November is Albanian Heritage Month

November is Albanian Heritage Month as proclaimed by the Ontario government in 2015. Albania is situated in eastern Europe, and the main language spoken is Albanian. The majority of Albanians identify as Muslim followed by Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic. There are approximately 29000 Canadians with Albanian ethnicities. The month of November is significant to people of Albanian origin as it commemorates the Albanian Declaration of Independence which took place on November 28, 1912. Albania also recognizes Liberation Day, a day that Albania was liberated from Nazi Germany forces after the Albanian resistance on November 29, 1944.

The proclamation of November as Albanian Heritage Month recognizes the diverse ways in which Albanian Canadians have contributed to the intricate social and cultural makeup of Ontario. It is a month to celebrate Albanian identity and acknowledge the histories and lived experiences of Albanian Canadians.



Holocaust Education Week

November 4 - November 10, 2024, marks the annual Holocaust Education Week (HEW). Learning about the Holocaust in classrooms, schools, and workplaces across the YRDSB is critical to countering antisemitism and other forms of hate.

The Holocaust was the systemic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of six million Jewish people by the Nazi regime and its allies, and it's critical that we not allow this cruel chapter of modern history to fade from memory. During Holocaust Education Week, it is



important to also acknowledge that other racialized people, the Romas, people with physical disabilities, and those who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+, among others, were also targeted and murdered by the Nazis. As one means of working towards communities free of intolerance, racism, discrimination, and hatred, educators are encouraged to discuss the Holocaust and the many people who put their lives on the line in the face of antisemitism and other forms of hate. Holocaust Education re-humanizes those who experienced and continue to experience the impact of the Holocaust. By giving voice to those who perished at hands of the Nazi's and their collaborators, as well as the survivors and their descendants, we can ensure historical truths are not trivialized or denied.

Bus Loop Safety

YRDSB Family Dashboard 家庭仪表板

YRDSB 很高兴推出我们新的家庭仪表板。仪表板将为您提供安全的一站式访问与您孩子的教育相关的信息和应用程序。它旨在让家庭更容易参与孩子的教育。在第一阶段，仪表板将包括分发成绩单时的安全访问以及指向父母/监护人有用信息的链接。

设置帐户前的重要说明：

- 如果您希望使用不同的电子邮件，请在创建帐户前联系学校以更新您存档的电子邮件。YRDSB 电子邮件地址（@yrdsb.ca, @gapps.yrdsb.ca）将不被接受。
- 每个帐户必须有一个唯一的电子邮件地址，如果您有一个共享的家庭地址，并且被多个联系人使用，您将只能设置一个帐户。如果您想设置个人帐户，其中一个联系人需要联系学校并更新他们在学校存档的电子邮件地址。
- 只要您存档的电子邮件与您所有孩子的一样，当您登录家庭仪表板时，您应该可以看到所有孩子的姓名。
- 密码长度至少为 8 个字符，最多为 256 个字符。需要以下四种字符中的三种：小写字母；大写字母、数字 (0-9)；符号。
- 显示名称是指创建帐户的父母/监护人。此名称不必与我们系统中的名称一致。
- 如果您不确定孩子的学生编号，则它是您孩子在 Google 课堂上的学生登录名。
- 您只需要一名学生的信息即可创建帐户。创建帐户后，只要您存档的电子邮件与您所有孩子的一样，当您登录家庭仪表板时，您应该可以看到所有孩子的姓名。

 3. 学生家庭住址邮政编码

条约承认周

“今天，一些加拿大人将条约视为他们历史上另一个时代的产物，与当前没有任何关系。原住民将条约视为尊重其民族地位的“活”协议，正如 1763 年皇家宣言所承认的那样。他们认为这是加拿大宪法第 35 条中提到的“固有权利”。（Maurice Switzer, “我们都是……条约人”，第 34 页）

RECOGNITION WEEK



条约承认周是 2024 年 11 月 3 日至 9 日。原住民是这片我们称之为安大略省的土地的原始居住者。英国王室（政府）和原住民谈判并签署了条约，目的是实现互惠互利。原住民作为独立、自治的国家签署了条约。尽管早期条约承诺并建立了相互尊重的伙伴关系，但原住民仍成为殖民政策的目标，这些政策旨在剥削、同化和消灭他们。

今天，安大略省政府正在努力重建与条约伙伴和原住民人民的信任和关系。这项工作的一部分包括[教育安大略省](#)人民了解条约在我们今天的生活和彼此关系中所扮演的角色。

加拿大正在与土著伙伴一起推进，通过加拿大各地的谈判来推进土著权利。要了解有关正在进行的谈判的更多信息，请访问[加拿大政府网站](#)。

在 2024 年 11 月 3 日至 9 日这一周，我们认识到条约的重要性，并提高人们对全省第一民族、梅蒂人和因纽特人与非原住民人民之间的条约关系的认识。安大略省有 46 项条约，我们都有责任认识、了解和遵守这些条约。

十一月是印度教传统月

十一月是印度教传统月。2016 年 12 月 8 日，安大略省根据《[印度教传统月法案](#)》将十一月指定为印度教传统月。2022 年 11 月是加拿大第一个正式的印度教传统月。在这个月，YRDSB 表彰和庆祝印度教加拿大人在过去、现在和未来的贡献以及对我们的社区的鼓舞人心的影响。

有些人认为印度教是世界上最古老的宗教之一，可以追溯到 10,000 多年前。印度教在全球拥有超过 9 亿信徒，是第三大宗教。印度教是一种一神教，崇拜一个神，同时承认其他神的存在。其中一些神灵包括梵天、湿婆、帕尔瓦蒂、拉克希米、象头神、穆鲁加、卡利和毗湿奴等。印度教包括全年庆祝的许多传统和节日。排灯节、九夜节和象头神节是安大略省、加拿大和世界各地的印度教徒参加的一些庆祝活动。对于加拿大印度教徒来说，基于信仰的习俗因社区、文化和世代而异。



十一月是阿尔巴尼亚文化传统月

安大略省政府于 2015 年宣布十一月为阿尔巴尼亚文化传统月。阿尔巴尼亚位于东欧，主要语言是阿尔巴尼亚语。大多数阿尔巴尼亚人自认为是穆斯林，其次是东正教和罗马天主教徒。大约有 29000 名加拿大人属于阿尔巴尼亚族。十一月对阿尔巴尼亚裔人士意义重大，因为它是为了纪念 1912 年 11 月 28 日发表的《阿尔巴尼亚独立宣言》。阿尔巴尼亚还承认解放日，即 1944 年 11 月 29 日阿尔巴尼亚抵抗后从纳粹德国军队中解放出来的一天。

宣布十一月为阿尔巴尼亚文化传统月，承认了阿尔巴尼亚加拿大人为安大略省错综复杂的社会和文化构成做出的多种贡献。这是一个庆祝阿尔巴尼亚身份并承认阿尔巴尼亚加拿大人的历史和生活经历的月份。



大屠杀教育周

2024 年 11 月 4 日至 11 月 10 日是一年一度的大屠杀教育周 (HEW)。在 YRDSB 的教室、学校和工作场所了解大屠杀对于打击反犹太主义和其他形式的仇恨至关重要。

大屠杀是纳粹政权及其盟友对六百万犹太人进行的系统性、国家支持的迫害和谋杀，我们必须不让这段残酷的现代历史从记忆中消失。在大屠杀教育周期间，还必须承认其他种族的人，包括罗姆人、身体残疾人士和自认为是 2SLGBTQIA+ 的人等，也成为纳粹的目标和谋杀对象。作为努力实现没有不宽容、种族主义、歧视和仇恨的社区的一种方式，我们鼓励教育工作者讨论大屠杀以及许多在反犹太主义和其他形式的仇恨面前冒着生命危险的人。

大屠杀教育重新赋予那些经历过和继续经历大屠杀影响的人以人性。通过为那些死于纳粹及其同谋之手的人以及幸存者及其后代发声，我们可以确保历史真相不会被轻视或否认。
