IB EXAMS (DP1 and DP2)

Below is the schedule for the upcoming IB exams. Please make sure your child is able to write the exam at the indicated date and time. Because the IB exams materials are strictly regulated and confidential, all IB students in the same time zone will write the same exam at around the same time.

There is no room for students to make up any exam if they missed the date indicated below. For DP1 students, the only option for writing a missed exam is writing the exam in the November exam session, but this is strongly discouraged as they are in Gr. 12 during November of the school year and they will be very busy meeting all expectations in their HL courses. Please let me know as soon as you have any concerns about the exams.

Using AI as a tool

Al is an emerging tool that is widely used in our daily life. From the IB standpoint, Al is a great tool for collecting ideas and brainstorming. "*The IB will not ban the use of Al software. The simplest reason is that it is an ineffective way to deal with innovation.*" (IBO, Feb 2025) What is more important is that students will need to keep in mind about academic integrity when using new technologies, including Al.

"Students should be aware that the IB does not regard any work produced—even only in part—by such tools, to be their own. Therefore, as with any quote or material from another source, it must be clear that AI-generated text, image or graph included in a piece of work, has been copied from such software..." (IBO, Feb 2025)

Please kindly remind your child to be aware of academic honesty. The standard of academic honesty is upheld in high school and beyond. Our teachers use various tools to investigate potential suspicious plagiarism situations.

The IB guidelines are also similar to the new YRDSB AI guidelines that were drafted in January 2025. From the YRDSB Guideline, it listed the responsibilities in using AI Tools. Transparency, Critical Thinking, Privacy and other areas are emphasized.
