- One course must be taken in each category



The DP: 6 Groups (HL & SL)

- Group 1- Studies in Language and Literature: English (HL)
- Group 2- Language Acquisition: French (SL)
- Group 3- Individuals and Societies: History (HL)
- Group 4- Sciences: Chemistry/Biology (HL)
- Group 5- Mathematics: Mathematics (SL)
- Group 6- Flexible: ARTS/Chemistry/Biology/ Physics/Geography (SL)

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The Core of IB

- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)
- Theory of Knowledge (ToK)
- Extended Essay (EE)



Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

- CAS is a requirement of the IB Diploma Programme and will be implemented over two years
- It enables students to demonstrate attributes of the learner profile in real and practical ways
- It involves students in a range of activities alongside their academic studies; Involvement in local and global community
- Students will be provided with opportunities to choose their own CAS experiences.
- CAS is individualized according to student interests, skills, values, and background
- May be a single event or series of sequential events

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

- CAS provides opportunities for self-determination, collaboration, accomplishment, and enjoyment
- CAS gives students a chance to explore, develop skills, take risks, lead projects, collaborate with others, persevere, evaluate choices, learn responsibility, and make ethical decisions
- CAS is not formally assessed, however, students reflect on their CAS experiences as part of the Diploma Programme, and provide evidence of achieving the learning outcomes for CAS:

Theory of Knowledge (ToK)

- **ToK** is a mandatory course that is part of the IB Diploma Programme
- **ToK** offers students the opportunity to:
 - reflect critically on the nature and areas
 of knowledge as well as diverse ways of
 knowing
 - consider the role and nature of knowledge in their own culture, in the cultures of others and in the world

Theory of Knowledge (ToK)

- **ToK** is assessed through an oral presentation and a 1,600 word essay
- The presentation assesses the ability of the students to apply ToK thinking to real-life situations
- The essay takes a more conceptual starting point

Extended Essay (EE)

- The extended essay is an independent, selfdirected piece of research
- 4,000-word paper
- Students are supported throughout the process of researching and writing with guidance from a mentor who is a teacher at the school

Extended Essay (EE)

The extended essay provides:

- practical preparation for undergraduate research
- an opportunity for students to investigate a topic of special interest to them, which is also related to one of the students' 6 DP subjects

Online Registration through EDSBY

- The online application
 - o opens on Friday, October 20th at 10:00 am
 - o closes on Wednesday, November 8th at 11:59 pm
- Registrations will be done through EDSBY
- An EDSBY account will need to be created in order to register your child for the IB Program
- We encourage you to set up your account early in the registration process beginning October 20th
- Payments will be accepted through PayPal. You do not have to have a PayPal account to pay but you will need a credit card or prepaid credit card to pay online.

Online Registration through EDSBY

- For YRDSB students:

 - if your information on your elementary school's file is not current, please contact the school
- Only one person (email address) will be able to register your child for the IB Program. Please decide which parent or guardian will be responsible for registration and communication.

- You can only apply to the IB school that is attached to your home address.
- To identify your IB school, visit the Board website >
 School Locator>Enter your home address.
- Transfers are not possible
- Transportation is not provided for the IB program
