Land Acknowledgement

The IB Mission statement says: "The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect."

To that end, it is important for us to understand our local area and the first peoples of the land.

As guests on Turtle Island, we would like to start by acknowledging that we are connecting virtually today from our spaces on land that has been shared with us so that we may work and learn together in service of the students who attend or will attend our schools. These schools are on the traditional territories of the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishinaabe peoples, whose presence here continues to this day. We would also like to acknowledge that the land we are on is at the meeting place of two treaties, the lands of the Mississaugas of the Credit and those of the First Nations of the Williams Treaty. We would like to thank them and other Indigenous peoples for sharing this land with us. We would also like to acknowledge the Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation as our closest Indigenous community and our partners in education.

It is important that we take the time to acknowledge this land and the people because the first step to reconciliation is recognizing the existence of Indigenous people. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada Calls to Action (numbers <u>62-63</u>) speak to the significance of education as the key to reconciliation. A shared understanding of how our collective past brought us to where we are today will help us walk together into a better future.



Timetable Considerations

- Students have a full timetable (four courses per semester)
- Students do not have space in their timetable for spares or non-IB courses
- Students are only able to take two sciences
 - this means that students cannot take all three during day school





IB Programme Fees

\$3,000.00 Total

- \$250 in grade 9
 - the grade 9 fee is payable at time of acceptance of offer of admission
- \$350 in grade 10
- \$1,200.00 per year in Grade 11 and Grade 12
- These fees cannot be used as tax deductions










School Year on School Locator





Personal Profile Form Tips
