### **Guidance Services**

On Monday, December 9, Grade 12 students participated in an informative session on completing supplementary applications associated with several different university programs. A supplementary application can consist of a questionnaire similar to a resume (Queen's University Concurrent Education, <a href="https://educ.queensu.ca/pse">https://educ.queensu.ca/pse</a>) or specifically designated questions related to a discipline of a students' choice. Here is example of a supplementary question being asked this year by the University of Toronto, Commerce program, "What accomplishments or endeavours outside of the classroom are you most proud of?" (<a href="https://rotmancommerce.utoronto.ca/future-students/our-supplemental-application/">https://rotmancommerce.utoronto.ca/future-students/our-supplemental-application/</a>. Another example of a supplementary can be a writing exercise or a timed-video submission (York University, Schulich Bachelor of Business Administration program (<a href="https://forms.schulich.yorku.ca/myfilestart">https://forms.schulich.yorku.ca/myfilestart</a>).

The supplementary application deadlines vary from school to school. This year, most of them are due on February 1, March 15 or March 31. We encourage students to set-up and check the university portals of their choice for more up-to-date information, once they apply through the Ontario Application Centre (OUAC).

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## **From The Literacy Desk**

Literacy Tip - Here are suggested strategies that can help your child increase his/her vocabulary:

- Encourage them to ask about new words they hear or read.
- Students learn new words through verbal interactions with others. Find ways to increase
  conversation time at home. Adults should make a conscious effort to use more complex language in
  their conversations with their students.
- Play word games.
- Visit museums, zoos, historical sites and plays. Through these experiences, students will gain exposure to new vocabulary.
- Provide books and magazines at home.
- Visit the library.

## **Upcoming EQAO Math Assessments**

In January 2020, Grade 9 students across Ontario will write the provincial Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics. This assessment is conducted by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency of the Government of Ontario. It will be administered to all students enrolled in a Grade 9 Applied or Academic Mathematics course in Semester One, and the results of this assessment will comprise 5% of each student's final mark in their Math course.

At Alexander Mackenzie High School, this assessment will be written by students on Wednesday, January 15 and Thursday, January 16, 2020. The assessment will consist of two test booklets, and students will be given 60 minutes to complete each booklet over the course of two days, during regularly scheduled Math periods.

In September 2020, EQAO will send our school a report on your child's achievement on the assessment, and we will send it home at that time.

# **Parking and Ticketing**

Ticketing at AMHS began on Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. All students and visitors are required to display a valid parking permit in their vehicle at all times in order to park on school property.
