Message from Our Trustee

As we enter another month of winter, this is a good time to be thinking about our health, well-being and the importance of self-care. We know that, like all of us, our students can focus better when they feel better. Our schools play an important role in health and mental health promotion and education, and fostering well-being and mental health is one of our <u>priorities as a school board</u>.

There is a lot of work taking place in our schools and board to create <u>healthy schools</u> and promote <u>mental</u> <u>health</u> and well-being, including:

- Providing training and resources for educators on strategies to support mentally healthy classrooms for all students, including holding a mental health conference.
- Hiring identity specific mental health workers and developing partnerships with <u>community partners</u> to serve the diverse needs of our students.
- Developing a <u>Student Suicide Intervention Protocol</u> to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions.
- Educating students about the risks of <u>substance use and misuse</u>, including <u>vaping</u> and <u>cannabis</u>.
- Providing strategies and supports for students in preparing for exams and managing stress.

This commitment is also reflected in Board policy like the <u>Healthy Schools and Workplaces</u> policy and procedures. Setting policy, which governs the operation of the Board, is one of the <u>roles of trustees</u>, and we greatly value the input provided by students, staff members, family and community members. I encourage you to look at the <u>policies under review</u> and share your feedback.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2020. At the Board meeting in December, trustees unanimously approved the addition of <u>new permanent Indigenous Trustee and Indigenous Student Trustee positions</u>. We are committed to Indigenous Education in our Board and it is important that these voices are represented at the table. We hope to fill the positions as soon as possible and will share more information as it becomes available.

Changes to AMHS School Day For September 2020

Alexander Mackenzie High School enrolment has been steadily growing since 2016 and is projected to continue to grow. Beginning in September 2020, adjustments to the school timetable will need to be made to accommodate increasing student enrolment.

Currently, Alexander Mackenzie High School operates with four (4) periods of instruction and a common lunch. Beginning September 2020, the bell times for Alexander Mackenzie High School will need to be adjusted to support five (5) periods of instruction, along with multiple lunch breaks. This modification will increase the capability of the school to accommodate more students.

The new bell times will shift the morning bell time to 10 minutes earlier, and the afternoon bell time to 15 minutes later. This model of the instructional day is common across York Region District School Board secondary schools. The chart below outlines the new start and end times of periods, which will go into effect beginning in September 2020.

If you child requires a timetable change for Semester 2 and has not had the opportunity to connect with Guidance prior to or during exams, ask them to come to Guidance by Monday, February 3 to obtain a grade-specific form. Please note that we cannot make any timetable changes without parental input; as such, your signature is required on the change form.

At this time, many of our courses are completely full, and therefore a timetable change may not be possible. Guidance will process only timetable changes that require a prerequisite for graduation, a missing prerequisite for a course where a student has been unsuccessful in Semester 1, compulsory courses, or to fill a "study period" / "spare" in the timetable.

Parking and Ticketing

Ticketing at AMHS began on Tuesday, September 3rd. All students and visitors are required to display a valid parking permit in their vehicle at all times in order to park on school property.
