Guidance Services

Students received their Course Verification forms this past Monday, March 9, in their homeroom classes. These sheets list all the course options your child has selected for next school year. Some important information:

1. We ask students to review their course selection carefully.

a. Current Grade 9 and 10 students must choose eight courses for next year.

b. Current Grade 11 and 12 students must have completed 24 credits before they are eligible for a spare on their timetable.

c. Grade 12 students must have a minimum of three courses per semester.

2. It is very important that students have chosen the correct courses for their post-secondary destination. Use the following websites to help your child in their research:

- b. www.Ontariocolleges.ca College Programs
- c. www.Apprenticesearch.com Apprenticeships

3. If all of the selections are correct, then students do not need to do anything. We ask them to keep this paper for their records.

4. If students wish to make a change, they should cross out the wrong code, and print the correct course code and course name beside the course they do not want. Course descriptions are listed on our website: https://app.myblueprint.ca/public/courses/yrdsb/mackenzie1

5. **Parents/guardians should sign the form if there are changes**, and return it to the Guidance Office no later than <u>Monday</u>, <u>April 6</u>, 2020.

Message from the Literacy Desk: With the Spring Break here, I hope students and families have an opportunity to rest. I would like to suggest that students use some time to review their OSSLT Student Workbook together with a parent or guardian. The school website, rebrand.ly/OSSLT, includes additional practice work. Please note that students must first sign in to their GAPPS account prior to accessing the site.

Literacy Tip: Talk about everyday topics, encouraging your child to be the 'expert' and use the technical terminology they are learning in school. For example, if learning about the weather in class, your child could tell you about the next day's forecast using words such as precipitation, humidity and isobars.

Parking and Ticketing

Ticketing at AMHS began on Tuesday, September 3rd. All students and visitors are required to display a valid parking permit in their vehicle at all times in order to park on school property. Any vehicle parked on AMHS property without a valid parking permit will be subject to ticketing. It is your responsibility to ensure

that a valid parking permit is clearly visible to our parking enforcement officers. Be sure to request a parking pass when you sign in at the Main Office - all visitors to the school must begin their visit there. **Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis, and availability cannot be guaranteed.**

If you are in the habit of dropping-off or picking-up your child at school, you have probably noticed the high volume of traffic that builds up in the parking lot / driveway loop at the front of the school, facing Major Mackenzie Drive.
