Summer School registration continues until June 25th, 2021. Summer school course offerings are not guaranteed as they are subject to sufficient enrolment, classroom and teacher availability.

Students who have selected a course for the 2021-2022 school year and have registered for the same course at summer school will have the course removed from their AMHS course selection.

Should a student drop a summer school course and need to take this course at AMHS it is the student's responsibility to contact the Guidance Department. Any courses that are selected after the creation of timetables are subject to sufficient course availability.

Summer School

Registration for Summer School is open from **April 20th until June 25th, 2021**. Classes will occur online using a synchronous model with asynchronous blocks. The learning platform is Google. YRDSB students will select courses online using myPathwayPlanner.
