Post-Secondary Accessibility Services - Field Trip

On Friday, November 29, Grade 12 graduating students with IEPs will be visiting Sheridan College and University of Toronto (UTM) – Mississauga Campus. They will attend seminars organized by the Financial Aid and Accessibility Services offices. They will be provided with crucial information regarding how to access services at **ANY** post-secondary institutions such as various accommodations, OSAP, scholarships and other services. They will also learn how to apply for funding to obtain a new psychological assessment required for post-secondary.

The cost for the trip is \$5.00, payable through SchoolCashOnline. Note that registration will be on a first-come, first-served basis, and space is limited.

Grade 10 students completed Lesson 1 on Monday, November 11 in preparation for this year's OSSLT. Those that missed the lesson were required to attend a make-up lesson on Thursday, November 14. Upcoming EQAO Math Assessments

In January 2020, Grade 9 students across Ontario will write the provincial Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics. This assessment is conducted by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency of the Government of Ontario. It will be administered to all students enrolled in a Grade 9 Applied or Academic Mathematics course in Semester One, and the results of this assessment will comprise 5% of each student's final mark in his / her Math course.

At Alexander Mackenzie High School, this assessment will be written by students on Wednesday, January 15 and Thursday, January 16, 2020. The assessment will consist of two test booklets, and students will be given 60 minutes to complete each booklet over the course of two days, during regularly scheduled Math periods.

A general information letter related to this assessment will be sent to the parents/guardians of students currently in Grade 9 Applied and Academic Math courses, on Monday, November 18.

In September 2020, EQAO will send our school a report on your child's achievement on the assessment, and we will send it home at that time.

Parking and Ticketing

Ticketing at AMHS began on Tuesday, September 3rd. All students and visitors are required to display a valid parking permit in their vehicle at all times in order to park on school property. Any vehicle parked on AMHS property without a valid parking permit will be subject to ticketing. It is your responsibility to ensure that a valid parking permit is clearly visible to our parking enforcement officers. Be sure to request a parking pass when you sign in at the Main Office - all visitors to the school must begin their visit there. Dropping-Off and Picking-Up Students

If you are in the habit of dropping-off or picking-up your child at school, you have probably noticed the high volume of traffic that builds up in the parking lot / driveway loop at the front of the school, facing Major Mackenzie Drive.

In an effort to alleviate the traffic congestion and keep traffic flowing smoothly, we ask that drivers <u>only</u> <u>turn right</u> when exiting from the school driveway onto Major Mackenzie Drive, both in the mornings and the afternoons. Thank you.
