Post-Secondary Accessibility Services - Field Trip

On Friday, November 29, Grade 12 graduating students with IEPs will be visiting Sheridan College and University of Toronto (UTM) – Mississauga Campus. They will attend seminars organized by the Financial Aid and Accessibility Services offices. They will be provided with crucial information regarding how to access services at **ANY** post-secondary institutions such as various accommodations, OSAP, scholarships and other services. They will also learn how to apply for funding to obtain a new psychological assessment required for post-secondary.

The cost for the trip is \$5.00, payable through SchoolCashOnline. Note that registration will be on a first-come, first-served basis, and space is limited.

Guidance Services

Here is some food for thought from *People for Education* concerning report cards:

What's the first thing you look at? Be honest. It's the grades, isn't it? But there is something just as critical for parents to focus on. Focus on the Learning Skills and Work Habits, which are foundational to academic success - responsibility, organization, independent work, collaboration, initiative, and self-regulation.

Research by neuroscientists and educational psychologists has shown that it is these skills that have the greatest impact on students' ability to succeed, not just in school, but in life. These are also the skills that parents can help build at home. Students whose parents have high expectations and who focus on building strong work habits and a positive attitude are more likely to be successful in school.

The information about your child's learning skills can help you support them in the areas that need improvement. Mid-term report cards, which just came home last week, provide a great opportunity for parents to initiate conversations about school. Review the report card with your child, talk about where they do well and where they may be struggling. Whether your child is struggling or doing very well, connect with your child's teachers via *TeachAssist*, or email.

Winners will be selected in June 2020; payout will occur once the gap year is done and proof of enrolment is supplied. Taking a gap year between high school and college or university has so many benefits. It gives students a chance to mature, to travel, to have new experiences and gain new perspectives. From The Literacy Desk

Our OSSLT Lesson 2 will take place on Monday, November 25, 2019 during all Grade 10 Period 2 classes. It is suggested that you avoid booking important appointments so that you child does not miss the lesson. All Grade 10 students who have missed the lesson - either due to absence, or if they are not in a Grade 10 class during Period 2 - must attend a make-up lesson. All make-up lessons will take place on the Friday following a missed lesson, during the Lunch period, in Room 163.

Your child has a copy of the workbook which includes the schedule. The schedule is also included on the school site rebrand.ly/osslt. Following each lesson, families are encouraged to review the lesson at home with their child.

Our **After School Literacy Program** is offered to all students writing the OSSLT this year. Lessons will take place after school for two consecutive weeks, starting on December 2, 2019. Registration forms can be picked up in the Main Office, and completed and signed permission forms were to be handed in to the Main Office by end of day, November 22, 2019.

Upcoming EQAO Math Assessments

In January 2020, Grade 9 students across Ontario will write the provincial Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics. This assessment is conducted by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency of the Government of Ontario. It will be administered to all students enrolled in a Grade 9 Applied or Academic Mathematics course in Semester One, and the results of this assessment will comprise 5% of each student's final mark in his / her Math course.

At Alexander Mackenzie High School, this assessment will be written by students on Wednesday, January 15 and Thursday, January 16, 2020. The assessment will consist of two test booklets, and students will be given 60 minutes to complete each booklet over the course of two days, during regularly scheduled Math periods.

A general information letter related to this assessment will be sent to the parents/guardians of students currently in Grade 9 Applied and Academic Math courses, on Monday, November 18.

In September 2020, EQAO will send our school a report on your child's achievement on the assessment, and we will send it home at that time.
