### **Guidance Services**

This week, Guidance counsellors ran a **Lunch-n-Learn** session for Grade 12 students with a focus on taking initial steps in planning their post-secondary applications. The lunch time session was focused on seven factors that are important for students to consider when choosing their "ideal" school/program. We plan to continue with the Grade 12 Lunch-n-Learn sessions every third Monday of each month. It is our hope that these sessions will help alleviate concerns, confusion and anxiousness with respect to available post-secondary choices. Next week, on October 29, we will also be running two detailed assemblies for all Grade 12 students applying to colleges and universities (\*see below).

Our **Pathway Evening** is scheduled for November 5, from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. The Pathway Evening is a joint venture between four different high schools in the area. This is a great opportunity for you and your child to gather information directly from college and university representatives. I highly recommend all Grade 11 and 12 parents come to this evening! In addition, on November 6, we are running **Post-Secondary Trips** for all our Grade 12 students to various colleges and universities. This is an exciting opportunity for students to visit various campuses, see their facilities and connect with the students and faculty. Please encourage your child to sign up for one of the trips through School Cash Online.

Did you know that the Guidance Department has a "Suggestion/Comment" box to capture student voice anonymously and at their convenience? Similar to the Town Halls, which we ran a few weeks ago, this box is an opportunity for students to continue to offer their input/insights/suggestions. At AMHS, we believe that the emphasis on Student Voice supports a culture of positive relationship within the entire school community.

## **Halloween Safety**

For many years, AMHS has celebrated **Hallowe'en**. This year, we will continue the tradition. Students will have many student-led activities, through various councils, to opt into that day. These will largely be situated in the Main Foyer and the Cafeteria.

Students may also choose to celebrate in costume, but are required to adhere to the following expectations:

- In compliance with YRDSB's Safe, Caring and Supportive Schools Policy #668.0.,
   costumes <u>MUST NOT</u> include weapons or replica weapons toy guns, knives, axes,
   swords, etc. of any kind are strictly prohibited.
- No MASKS may be worn. Any article of clothing or face-painting that conceals ones face is prohibited.
- In keeping with our Appropriate Attire Policy, students must ensure that their costume is not
  offensive in any way, or too revealing.

We ask that parents check-in with their children in these regards, to help keep Hallowe'en at AMHS safe and fun for all.

## **Parking and Ticketing**

Ticketing at AMHS began on Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. All students and visitors are required to display a valid parking permit in their vehicle at all times in order to park on school property. Any vehicle parked on AMHS property without a valid parking permit will be subject to ticketing. It is your responsibility to ensure that a valid parking permit is clearly visible to our parking enforcement officers. Be sure to request a parking pass when you sign in at the Main Office - all visitors to the school must begin their visit there. # **Dropping-Off and Picking-Up Students**

If you are in the habit of dropping-off or picking-up your child at school, you have probably noticed the high volume of traffic that builds up in the parking lot / driveway loop at the front of the school, facing Major Mackenzie Drive.
