These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.







1. School Year Start Up It has been a very successful start to the school year Great energy in the building Clubs, sports starting up **Caring and Safe Schools** assembly






- 2. Enrolment Update


