International Baccalaureate:

- Course selection is taking place in February. Grade 9s have 2 electives
- Grade 10s have 1 elective or 2 if they take civics/careers over the summer
- Grades 11 and 12 in the DP IB Diploma; no electives.
 - · IB exams take place in May
 - Our first cohort is graduating this year (17 students) and we are very excited.
 - Our grade 8 intake is done, we are still on rolling offers to ensure our 116 spots are filled.
