Visual Arts

Students are finishing up their courses with projects ranging from e-portfolios to social justice posters and genre parody films. Many grade 9 students have chosen to participate in the York Region Crime Stopper poster contest.

The Arts and Culture Council hosted a virtual workshop with York Region artist Judy Sherman last week. Judy shared her expertise on oil painting and life as a working artist with the students. Next week, the ACC has another speaker from a local studio who will be discussing portfolios and careers in art.

Geography:

Grade 12 World Issues students are finishing up their culminating assignment. They began the assignment in October. They had to pick an issue and find an organization that helps that

specific issue. They had to fundraise and bring awareness to the issue they chose. Students have been choosing issues surrounding poverty, climate change, homelessness, gender equality, access to health care and so much more. Library Learning Commons

The LLC has purchased three additional databases as part of our EBSCO subscription.

- **History Reference Center** is a full-text database covering both U.S. and world history topics and features historical reference books, magazines, journals and thousands of primary source documents.
- Science Reference Center is a database that contains full text for hundreds of science magazines, journals, encyclopedias, reference books and a vast collection of images.
- Literary Reference Center Plus is a database covering all literary genres and timeframes. It includes thousands of full-text poems, short stories, synopses, critical essays, literary journals, reference books and author biographies.

Literacy

One way that AMHS has chosen to assist our students with the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test is by offering extra support to reinforce literacy skills. A Google Classroom has been developed where students can access a number of pre-recorded lessons designed to promote reading and writing strategies. These lessons will make a difference in the student's understanding and confidence related to the various tasks they will be required to complete on the OSSLT. In addition, live lessons took place where students were able to practice a number of reading and writing strategies and they received immediate feedback from the Literacy Resource Teacher.

Mathematics Department

On behalf of the Mathematics Department, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the parents for their support and the students for their hard work in Semester One. As we approach the end of this semester, it is crucial for students to keep up with their good effort in finishing the final assessments and assignments to enhance their achievement. Despite COVID-19, the Math programs at Alexander Mackenzie continue to thrive with rigorous curriculum delivered by the staff and outstanding results achieved by the students. For instance, the Mathematics Council continues to support students who intend to take part in the Waterloo Math Contests on an individual basis. We would also like to thank the Math teachers, who have been offering extra help on-line to address individual learning needs. As the final assessments/assignments are just around the corner, I would like to remind students to approach their teachers should they need extra help to prepare for them. We wish students all the best as they wrap up the first semester. We also welcome the input of parents as we prepare for the beginning of the second semester.
