In the new school year, the team will continue promoting the school's Eco Station and the clothing collection box in the school parking lot. the goal is to support good stewardship. Eco tips are included in each weekly family bulletin sent home electronically. We have postponed a school trip organized by York University until the new year. Community Class, Special Education and Eco Team:

The students from the community classes participated in many hands-on activities throughout the year to support functional life skills. They grew and cultivated plants using the school's greenhouse. They made use of donated fabrics by measuring, cutting and sewing shopping bags and quilts. They helped the Eco Team by collecting and sorting GOOS (good on one side) paper so that they can be used to create writing pads. Students and teachers are eager to think of more creative ideas next year to help develop skills.

Healthy Snacks Program:

The school will continue the healthy snack program once we are back in school. Since we were not able to use all of our grant money this academic year, we will carry this over into the new school year. Throughout the year, we offered fresh fruit, and packaged dry goods such as raisins, bread sticks, granola bars. We hope to continue offering these snacks in an effort to support good eating habits.

International Baccalaureate

Update regarding fees for the IB Program:

Formal registration to the IB Diploma Programme includes the payment of fees. The total cost for next year is \$1,545.00. The amount includes payment of exam fees, external

assessment marking fees, and the associated costs of running the IB Diploma Programme at Alexander Mackenzie High School.

Knowing that this year is not a typical one and that our collective circumstances are varied, we have not sent out a request for payments yet. To mitigate some of the pressures that families are currently experiencing, we have delayed the first payment until August. There will be three installments: \$500.00 in August; \$ 500.00 in September; and \$545.00 in October.
