Criteria must include students in face-to-face and SVS where Alex Mackenzie is their homeschool Questions:

- Should SC members be part of the process for selecting the recipients?

School will be looking at criteria for all awards and will provide SC members with final criteria to incorporate into the graduation award. Staff do feel it is important to get input from SC members into criteria.
