 - French immersion has declined and more mature community
 - o Small amount of elementary feeder schools
 - expected to increase in time, partially due to construction happening on Yonge St
 - future population increase expected; this is the beginning of many steps
- Question In 2028 it looks like AMHS will still be above capacity while Langstaff will still be low. Is there a reason not to move the boundary further?
 - travel would be further for students to travel to Langstaff even though they are closer to AMHS
 - look at all programs across the region and look at how it can be balanced
 - o more development and intensification expected along Yonge and Bayview
 - o in the future will be looking at all Richmond Hill area to balance further
