

Dual Credit


Allows you to take college courses that count both toward your high school diploma (OSSD) and a postsecondary certificate, diploma or apprenticeship certification

Alternate Courses

 - Be sure you pick alternates that you are interested in as you may end up with them and will not be able to change them at a later date.

Spare Policy

- Students with fewer than 24 credits completed MAY NOT have a spare in their timetable
- Full-Time
 - You must take at least 3 courses each semester to be considered a full-time student



Summer School

- If you plan on taking summer school (or private school) you must speak with your guidance counsellor as there is no way to indicate it on the planner
- Registration for summer school is April/May
