1	credit in the arts

0.5	credit in career studies

April

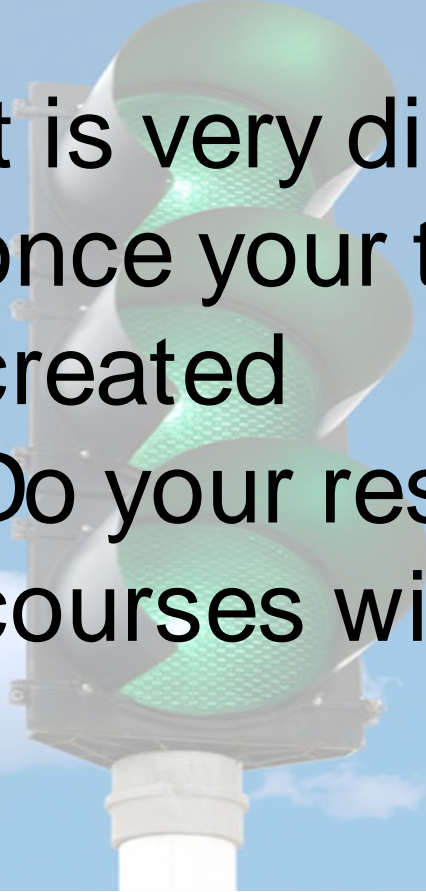
- Summer school sign-up begins

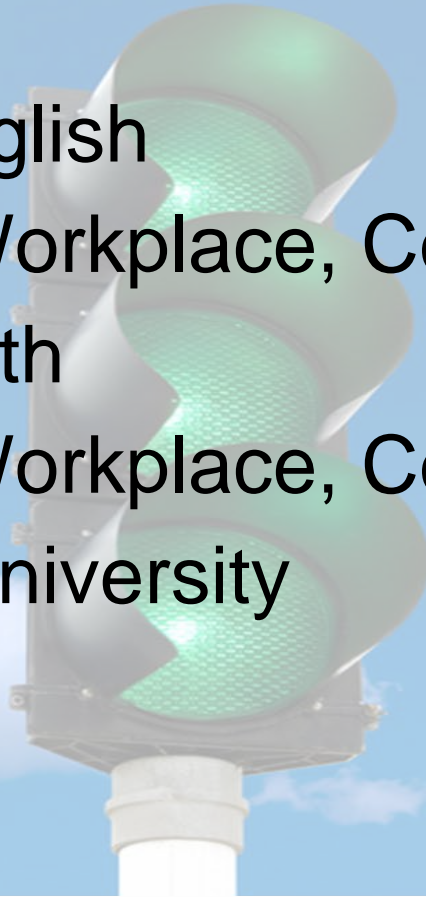

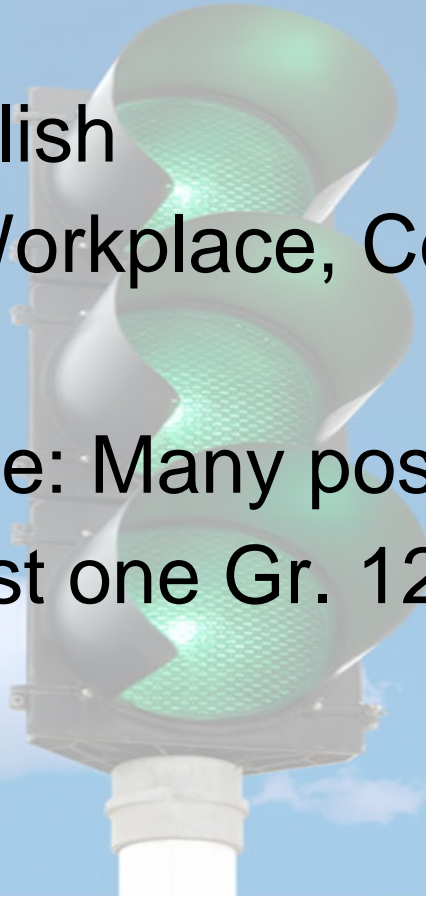



- Use this if you **PLAN** on taking a course at summer school or private school. But remember,
  - **YOU ARE NOT REGISTERED FOR SUMMER SCHOOL**
- You will still need to register in **April/May**
