

Fight the Bite! Protect yourself against West Nile virus and Lyme disease

Whether you are heading outdoors to keep active, go camping or work in your garden, protect yourself and your family against West Nile virus and Lyme disease. West Nile virus is spread to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito, while Lyme disease is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick.

What you can do:

Cover up; wear light coloured, long-sleeved shirts and pants when you go outdoors

Use an insect repellent containing DEET or icaridin

Check yourself and your children for ticks

Remove attached ticks as quickly as possible

Clean up standing water around your home where mosquitoes like to breed










Figure This! Take two identical sheets of paper.
[An ordinary sheet of paper measures 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches.] Roll one sheet into a short cylinder and the other into a tall cylinder. Set them both on a flat surface. Does one hold more than the other?



Hint: Place the taller cylinder inside the shorter one. Fill the taller one with dry cereal, rice, or popcorn; then remove it from the shorter cylinder. Which holds more?

Making visual estimates and finding volumes are useful skills.

Designers and engineers use these skills to find economical ways to package and protect items.

April Answer: It takes about 15minutes for a heart to beat 1,000 times. On January 10, 2000, your heart would have beat about 1million times. 27 years later your hear would reach about 1 billion beats.
