Day School e-Learning Courses – Offered in Semester 2, February 2019

Registration is now open for day school e-Learning courses through the Guidance Department. As long as a student is taking a minimum of two courses at Aurora High School, they are eligible for this program. There is no charge for the course and the course appears on the student's Aurora High School timetable. e-Learning courses are best suited for students who are self-motivated, independent learners. All work is submitted electronically to the e-Learning teacher and the exam is written at Aurora High School on a computer. Interested students may stop into Guidance to fill out a request form.
