
February is Black History Month


library and in the glass display cabinet in the front foyer along with posters and primary source documents honouring Black History month.














Guidance News

The course selection assembly for students in Grades 10-11 occurred yesterday in Period 2. All students in every grade were provided with course selection information. Students with a period 1 spare have been asked to come in to Guidance to pick up their course selection information.

Career Cruising will open for electronic submissions on Monday February 12th and are

due by Friday, February 23rd.

Upon submitting electronically, students must also hand in a parent\guardian signed course selection page to their homeroom teacher.

Ontario Drama Festival at Aurora HS!

The Department of Dramatic Arts is proud to announce that on Wednesday, February 21st, 2018, at 7pm, Aurora High School will be hosting the 2018 Ontario Drama Festival (formerly known as Tphe Sears Ontario Drama Festival), the largest student drama festival in Canada since 1946. The title sponsor for this year is the National Theatre School.

Three plays produced by three schools will be performed on this night and adjudicated by a professional artist. Joining students from **Aurora High School** in presenting their work will be students from **Burr Oak Secondary School** and **Alexander Mackenzie High School**. A public adjudication will immediately follow where the professional artist will offer a brief feedback of each show, before engaging in a longer, private adjudication reserved only for students and teacher-supervisors involved in the productions.

Two intermissions will occur between the shows and refreshments will be sold. Run-times for each show can vary from 15-50 minutes. This is the first stage of the festival, the District Level. Shows selected to advance will perform next month at the Regional Showcase hosted by York University, and if selected again, will perform once more at the Ontario Showcase hosted by St. Benedict CSS, Cambridge, where the top 12 shows of Ontario will be celebrated.

Ticket information and prices are as follows:

Each ticket is a 2-week pass to the Ontario Drama Festival - Central York District, allowing the ticket-holder access to *all* festival performances in this jurisdiction at various venues:

- Tickets purchased at the doors will be\$12 dollars / ea.
- Tickets bought online BEFORE Feb 21 will be\$8 dollars / ea.*
- * Online ticket orders will be tracked and buyers will be presented with actual ticket passes by Friday, Feb 16/18

I hope you take advantage of this wonderful opportunity. For 71 years, the festival has been a profound educational highlight to generations of high school students. On **Wednesday**, **February 2018**, please join us in welcoming this worthy tradition to Aurora High School.

Important Information for Students Turning 18:

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18.

If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians.

Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the <u>Consent for Information Sharing</u> form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance and behaviour.
