WORKS CITED RULES

- **Works Cited** entries must be arranged in **alphabetical order**
- The **second line** in a **Works Cited** entry must be **indented**
- Each **source** in the **Works Cited** must have at least one **embedded reference**, **footnote**, or **endnote** in your essay or assignment
- When **referencing** a **web page** you must include the **paragraph number** if a page number is not provided.



MLA (Modern Language Association) style is most commonly used to write papers and cite sources within the liberal arts and humanities.
