**Community Vaccination Clinics:** Due to York Region Public Health's continued COVID-19 response, non-essential Public Health services such as school-based vaccination clinics for students continue to be on hold until further notice. Starting in November, York Region Public Health will be providing community vaccination clinics for all eligible grade 7 students who will miss their doses of vaccines usually offered in their school. In addition, all eligible grade 8 and grade 9 students who missed any doses of these vaccines due to school closures and the pandemic response will also be able to attend a community vaccination clinic to receive their Hepatitis C, Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and Meningococcal vaccines.

**Social Media and Recent Tik Tok Trends:** At our school, we recognise that some students may have social media accounts (e.g., Instagram, TikTok). Social media has many benefits including helping us to stay connected. Unfortunately, it also can be used in ways that spread hurt, misinformation, and dangerous trends. While we have engaged in lessons about online safety, we suggest that families support this learning and have ongoing discussions about social media presence and how to act online. To help support these discussions we encourage families to look at Media Smarts Social Media Tip Sheet and Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada 12 Quick Privacy Tips for Parents.

We have become aware of a challenge on TikTok that encourages students to do certain activities at school which includes damaging school property, physical assault, sexual assault, among others. None of these activities is acceptable in our school. Activities that happen online and social media trends may have a negative impact on our school climate. As each student and staff member has the right to learn in a safe, positive, respectful and inclusive environment, we will address all incidents that have a negative impact on our school. This will include the administration using progressive discipline and depending on the situation, may also include involving police.

**COVID-19: Screening Update:** Staff, students and visitors (including Occasional/Temp Staff) will be using the <u>NEW York Region Public Health COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool (dated September 28, 2021) in</u> their daily online self-assessment prior to entering the school. The link can be accessed by computer, tablet or Smartphone.

Asynchronous Learning Day: By now you should have received a memo from the Board regarding an asynchronous learning day on Friday,October 15th. This additional professional learning will enable us to share effective practices and support, and be responsive to some of the feedback we have heard. We are committed to creating learning environments that enable all of our students, both in-person and remote, to be successful, and feel connected and supported. Schools will be closed to students on Friday, October 15. Please do not send your child to school. Asynchronous (not live) learning activities will be provided to students in order to support their continued learning.
