WINTER WEATHER/BUS TRANSPORTATION:

Winter weather can be snowy and sometimes hazardous. In the next few months, it is sometimes necessary to cancel school buses and occasionally, close the school as a result of more severe weather conditions. Any cancellation of buses does not mean that the school is closed however. Please note that <u>if bus transportation is cancelled in the morning</u>, then buses are cancelled for the entire day (including all extra-curricular and field trips). If you choose to drop off a student who normally takes a bus, <u>arrangements must be made to pick them up at the end of the school day as well</u>.

HEAD LICE:

Each year, and usually at this time, we hear about cases of head lice in our school. Head lice are tiny wingless insects with flattened bodies. The eggs or "nits" are yellowish white in colour, appear like dandruff and stick to even the cleanest hair like cement and are very difficult to remove. If head lice are found, the children must be removed from school until they are properly treated. The children are then re-checked when they return to help prevent any further spread of head lice in the class. Information letters will be sent home in January as these issues tend to be caused by cooler weather and sharing of hats. Please check your children at home before returning from the holidays or for more information on this problem contact the Region of York Public Health Department at 905-896-8004.


2014-2015 YEARBOOK
