EQAO – GRADE 6:

Each spring the *Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO)* administers annual testing in both Math and Language with all Grade 3 and 6 students across the province. These tests occur in each elementary school from May 25 to June 4, 2015. It is important that all of our Grade 3 and Grade 6 children are at school and properly prepared to do their best during this testing period. Each test session will be approximately one hour in length with extra time available if needed.

If you have a child in Grade 6 please plan any personal appointments or outside activities to avoid **our test dates MAY 25**, **26**, **27**, **28 and JUNE 1 and 2** inclusive. Speak to the classroom teacher if you have any questions or think there may be any conflicts. Attendance and proper rest will be highly beneficial during the two week testing period. Letters regarding any students who receive special accommodations for the test have gone home recently.
