A Message from your Administration Team

At this time of year, we are in the process of creating a school organization for the 2015-2016 school year. As most of you are aware, the Ontario Ministry of Education adheres to a hard cap of 20 students in each primary (grades 1—3) classroom. Although limiting class sizes is certainly a positive move, it does introduce a number of challenges. Flexibility is limited and consequently combined classes are continuing to be more prevalent in school organizations. We recognize that parents/guardians may have new and/or important information to share about their child (e.g., a recent medical diagnosis, peer relationships which exist outside of school, learning style, individual and family issues, etc.) which may impact upon class placement decisions. If you wish to express, **IN WRITING** any information that should be considered as we begin to tentatively place students in classes, we ask that you do so before the **May 15th** deadline.

Our primary goal is to develop balanced classes that reflect the diversity of our community and allow for a variety of abilities, interest and talents of our learners to be successful next year. Teachers work diligently to balance the classrooms in terms of gender, academic ability and social and emotional concerns. Class placement is an important and complex process that takes many hours of thought and discussion, so it is imperative that families adhere to the May 15th deadline. Your input is valuable however should not be considered confirmation of a particular class placement. Because of changing enrolment patterns in the spring and summer months, final class placement will not be shared until the first day of school in September.

WE ARE GROWING IN SEPTEMBER:

Renovations to Aurora Senior Public School to accommodate George Street PS students have already begun. These renovations will include new Kindergarten classrooms and outdoor play area, as well as Science, Music and Art classroom reconfigurations and renovations to our gym and lunchroom. In September 2015 all students in the George Street PS/Aurora Senior PS boundary from JK to Grade 8 will attend the new and improved Aurora Senior PS. The Board will be deciding on a new school name later this spring. The school community will also be notified of any decision with respect to the George Street building.

Each spring the *Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO)* administers annual testing in both Math and Language with all Grade 3 and 6 students across the province. These tests occur in each elementary school from May 25 to June 4, 2015. It is important that all of our Grade 3 and Grade 6 children are at school and properly prepared to do their best during this testing period. Each test session will be approximately one hour in length with extra time available if needed. If you have a child in Grade 3 please plan any personal appointments or outside activities to avoid our test dates MAY 26, 27, 28, 29 and JUNE 1 and 2 inclusive. Speak to the classroom teacher if you have any questions or think there may be any conflicts. Attendance and proper rest will be highly beneficial during the two week testing period.
