BEFORE & AFTER CAMP CARE

Informal/non-structured activities, such as cards, board games, crafts and movies are offered. Campers are supervised by the camp staff. You must sign up for the entire week. Children must be signed out by parents/guardians before leaving each day. You can sign up for both before and after care services if required.

MEAL PLAN

Campers have the option of bringing their own lunch each day or signing up for the meal plan option. The meal plan is catered and set up buffet style. Campers can select a hot or cold entrée, side dish, fruit or dessert and drink. The meal plan is a two week rotation and some items will be subject to change. Snacks are not provided. Anyone with serious food allergies or dietary restrictions are encouraged to bring their own lunch. We are sensitive to food allergies and do our very best to accommodate all children. We cannot guarantee a 100% peanut or nut fee environment. We have a vegetarian option available daily. All meals will be served indoors to optimize food quality (except for scheduled cookouts).

TAXES

HST will be applied to all additional services ie. Busing, Meal Plan and Extended Camper Care.

HST does not apply to Camp Registration Fees for children 14 years and under.

NOTE: Busing, Meal Plan, Before and After Camp Care services CAN be added after your initial registration. Email your request to add a service at least one week prior to the week your child is registered. It is not an option to add these services the week your child is enrolled in camp.

BUSING

Our bus transportation service is provided by Stock Transportation. We do not provide door to door service. New for 2015, we have added a South/West Route that covers Woodbridge, Maple and King City. We offer 5 Routes in total for the convenience of our camper families. We suggest that you arrive at the bus stop 10 minutes prior to the times indicated to drop off and pick up your child. When selecting the bus route at the time of registration you will have to select and commit to a specific bus stop code (i.e., B2 or E3, etc.). We do NOT allow parents to select a drop off/pick up at different locations – for your child's safety, we will never make an exception to this. The bus will wait 5-minutes at each stop for the parents to arrive and then continue to the next bus stop. If a parent does not pick up their camper at the scheduled bus stop at the scheduled time, the child will be taken to the next stop and so on and eventually to either the King Day Camp or Newnham Summer Camp After Camp Care Programs.

If you are going to be late, please contact the office to make after-care arrangements. Parents will be required to pay for this additional service.

F.I.E.L.D PROGRAMS (AGE 4-7

F.I.E.L.D stands for Fun, Interactive, Experiential, Learning Opportunities that are Developmentally appropriate. This acronym is the foundation of all F.I.E.L.D activities.

The F.I.E.L.D campers will have a classroom designated as their "home-space" and will eat lunch inside their air-conditioned classroom each day to get a break from the sun and heat! F.I.E.L.D campers will visit the waterfront for their daily swim session. Sessions take place in our supervised waterfront area and/or in our three foot deep above ground swimming pool (weather permitting). F.I.E.L.D campers will also have the opportunity to visit the Craft, Nature and Music specialists and explore many of our magical theme areas at camp. Other activities include nature hikes, voyageur canoe rides, group games, land-based water play, and much, much more!

BADGER PROGRAM (AGE 8 & 9)

On the first day of a new session, the Badger campers will meet, greet and review their week. Essential group development activities take place on the first morning to set the tone for a positive week as it relates to: communication, cooperation, problem solving and trust. Badgers will participate in the following activities on 5-day weeks, some program-modification will happen on the 4-day week (week #5).

CHALLENGER PROGRAMS (AGE 10 & 11)

CHALLENGER CABIN GROUPS

This program is geared towards those campers who have just graduated from the Badger program or, are new to KDC. This program will include an introductory experience to: kayaking, canoeing, archery, climbing, orienteering, and more!

CHALLENGER DISCOVERY

Campers will learn basic outdoor survival skills. These will include shelter and fire building, survival skills in the woods, orienteering, knots, fishing, and some relevant ecology. There's lots of time to explore the lakeshore in the replica voyageur canoes and hike through the 700 acres of property. Challengers will put all their newly learned skills to the test on an all-day 'trip' on the property. They will paddle and hike to a special location known as Hemlock Point where they will set-up camp, build a cooking fire and enjoy their cookout lunch. The cost of the cookout lunch is included in the fee. Due to the success of this program, we are accommodating an extra 10 campers per week (20 campers per week total).

CHALLENGER 1/2 DAY (AM & PM) OPTIONS

Campers are able to choose two options for the week upon registration. One option will take place in the morning every day and the other option will take place in the afternoon every day. EXPLORER PROGRAMS (AGE 12 & 13)

EXPLORER DISCOVERY

These campers will have the opportunity to hike, learn camping skills, do some map and compass work, and cook over an open fire. The highlight of this program is a paddle and hike to Hemlock Point for an all-day adventure and cookout! Campers will also have the chance to further their paddling skills as well as enjoy other land-based activities like archery. The cost of the cookout lunch is included in the fee.

EXPLORER 1/2 DAY (AM & PM) OPTIONS

Campers are able to choose two options for the week upon registration. One option will take place in the morning every day and the other option will take place in the afternoon every day. The 6 Outdoor Skill options you may choose from are listed below (greater program detail available on the website):

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS (AGE 12-14)

CLIMBING SPECIALTY

This program is aimed at developing competent and capable sport climbers and will focus on climbing, bouldering techniques, and belay skills. Upon completion of a week of specialty camp you will know the important knots, have a good understanding of technique, and be able to belay with a variety of devices. Climbing Shoes which can be purchased from most outdoor stores are beneficial to a successful experience in this program. KDC will provide climbing shoes to those campers that do not have their own.

GIRLS OUTDOORS

The Girls Outdoors program will be a perfect multi-venture program for the all-around outdoor girl. In a recreational setting (not competitive), these girls will experience canoeing, kayaking, air, mountain biking, hiking, swimming, paddle-boarding, slack-lining and more!

MOUNTAIN BIKE SPECIALTY

Campers registered in this program must be competent and experienced trail riders as they will ride more advanced trails and be introduced to more technical skills. The highlight of this program is an off-site excursion to Albion Hills Conservation Area to ride a more extensive trail network (on 5-day weeks). KDC will supply campers with Specialized Bikes to use for the week. Campers need to bring a (labeled) CSA approved bike helmet and water bottle. The cost of the bagged lunch on field trip weeks is included in the fee.

WATERCRAFT SPECIALTY

Due to an overwhelming request from our camper families, we created a watercraft-based program in 2014 that further developed the boating hard-skills of campers age 12-14. Campers are required to come to this session with sound knowledge of the different paddling techniques, basic water safety and be comfortable in and around the waterfront, docks and boathouse. These campers will be on water for the majority of each session.

VOYAGEUR MULTI-VENTURES

This program has a unique, low-structure especially designed for the 14 year old camper. It provides a mix of land and water activities daily. INTEGRATION PROGRAM (AGE 4-14, WORK ROLE AGE 15-19)

The Integration program can accommodate 7 campers, age 4-19 per week, providing them with a 1:1 support ratio of staff to camper. The integration camper age is 4-14 and the integration work role age is 15-19. The Integration Work Role is available to a maximum of 1 camper per week. The Integration Families register online. Registered campers will receive a call and/or email early in the Spring from our Integration Supervisor to set up a call or meeting with you and your family! Parents are also required to complete a detailed Camper Profile document that will help us better serve the needs of your camper.
