ELEMENTARY SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

Our school operates a safe arrival program which requires that we check the whereabouts of all students who are absent or late each day. We need your help! If your child(ren) will be absent from school, please call the school office at 905.727.4921 to let us know. Please leave a message on the school answering machine indicating your child's name, grade and his/her teacher's name and the reason for the absence/ late, i.e. illness, appointment, etc. If we cannot locate a student during the arrival in the morning, we will call any emergency contacts listed at the office or if necessary, and according to our Board policy, we then need to notify the police. We have an answering machine that is on at night and weekends for you to leave a message.

REPORTING TO THE OFFICE

Please remember that the first place to visit at school is <u>the office</u>. The only way that we can assure the safety of all students is with <u>your full participation</u>! A "Sign-In" sheet is located in the office, and requires all visitors or volunteers to sign in when entering the building. Please sign in at the office and obtain a "Visitor" badge so that you can quickly be identified by staff in the halls. Going directly to your child's classroom only causes confusion in the hallways.
