| - New School Resource - UFLI <br> - University of Florida Literacy Institute (UFLI, pronounced "you fly"). UFLI is an ongoing effort by UF faculty, students, and staff to improve literacy outcomes for children learning to read. <br> - This resource focuses on the science of reading and skills that build on each other (ie. phonics, etc.) <br> - There are free online resources for parents. UFLI is in line with the government's "Right to Read" report. Resources will be going home with students as they progress through the program. <br> - This is the first year that our school has used it. It was ordered in November and only just arrived. It was designed to be used by entire primary classes, but it can be used for other students as well who would benefit from it (not just primary grades). <br> - Council Forum <br> - Will be held on February 15. 2-3 council members can attend. It is being held in person at Sutton and Mulock High Schools. More information about which location our members should attend is still to come. |  | 2-3 council members can attend the forum. |

## Teacher Report

- Holiday Concert Recap
- Highly successful; lots of fun.
- Extracurriculars
- Free-throw competition was held today. One student is moving on.
- Junior girls' and boys' volleyball is underway. Off-site tournaments for both are coming up soon (next couple of weeks).
- Games Club is still going strong.
- Play Program is starting up. It is for grades 4-5. A Public Health nurse comes to the school to train students to become "play leaders" who would then be leaders for grades K-3 at recesses. The training will take place over 3 lunch hours and gives these grade 4-5 students a leadership opportunity. Each leader will pick 1 recess per week to lead the K-3 students in cooperative games. Students seem engaged and are giving lots of great ideas.
- Plans for Rest of the Year
- Running any extracurricular activity is done by school staff on a strictly voluntary basis.
- A staff volunteer to run the yearbook has not yet come forward.


## Council Business

- Pizza Toonie Slices
- At present, we are breaking even on Toonie sales (each slice costs us $\$ 2$ ).
- Should we increase the price to $\$ 3$ per slice?

- Kid's Kitchen
- Craig has set up Kid's Kitchen as a second lunch option for parents.
- Lunch is being offered every Tuesday.
- Parents can log into the website and order directly from them. Parents have the option to switch what is ordered every week and can order as often as they want.
- The school earns $\$ 0.25$ per order. While this is not as profitable as our pizza program, it requires no volunteers. As discussed, this is more of a convenience to parents.
