Kindergarten Registration for September 2024 began January 19, 2024. Children who turn four or five years old during 2024, live within the school boundary, and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

- Online at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten</u>. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.
- Download the <u>Elementary School Registration Form</u> at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten</u> and email the completed form to <u>barbara.reid.ps@yrdsb.ca</u>.
- Phone us at 905-591-3800. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation.
- Visit the school office to drop off or complete a registration form.

Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the <u>required documents</u>.

Students from Grades 5-8 of all identities are invited to learn about Tamil identity and heritage on February 3, 2024. Lunch is provided.



Online Puzzles

Puzzles give meaningful and enjoyable problem solving opportunities to learn math while having fun. They can be played individually or collaboratively with a friend or family member, and at home or on the go.

<u>Ken Ken</u> Puzzles	Your goal is to fill in the whole grid with numbers, making sure that no numbers are repeated in any row or column.
<u>Sudoku</u> Puzzles	Sudoku is played on a square grid of 9 x 9 spaces. Within the rows and columns are 9 "squares" (made up of 3 x 3 spaces). Each row, column and square (9 spaces each) needs to be filled out with the numbers 1-9, without repeating any numbers within the row, column or square.
Magic Squares	Magic squares are number puzzles that are played on a square grid. The puzzle is complete when all of the rows, columns, and both diagonals add up to the same number.
<u>Digits</u>	Similar to wordle, players use a combination of given numbers to reach a target number. You can use any operation to get as close to the target number as you can.

Which is a better deal, one round pizza that is 18 inches in diameter for \$15 or two round pizzas that are both 12 inches in diameter for \$15?


Answer:

The 18 inch diameter pizza is a better deal. The area of a circle can be found by the formula A=pi x radius x radius. The area of the top of the 18 inch diameter pizza is about 254 square inches. The area of the top of one 12 inch diameter pizza is about 113 square inches so two of them

would have a top area of about 226 square inches. (Which one would be a better deal if you wanted more crust?)
