### SHSM - Specialist High Skills Major

This is our 5th year of SHSM – Specialist High Skills Major – We currently have Business and Non-Profit Sectors. This program is for students interested in getting an in-depth program in their future choice of career. Students take a bundle of sector courses in Gr.11 and Gr.12 and gain experience by taking Co-op in a business or non-profit related placement. They are busy working in establishments in Richmond Hill at The Sheraton Hotel in Human Resources and Accounting; Sales and Marketing Firms; High Tech Court and Small Claims Court and Caribbean North Charities to name a few. SHSM students have also been busy taking their additional qualifications in SFA, CPR, WHMIS, Customer Service, Leadership, Ethical Considerations and Ergonomics.

# <u>OYAP – Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program</u>

We had some students signed as apprentices with the College of Trades as Automotive Service Technicians, in the Culinary Arts, as Child Development Practitioners, and an Arborist. We also had a student in the Accelerated Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program working as a mechanic at their Co-op Placement and taking their Level One Apprenticeship Training for 8 weeks April-June at Centennial College — Ashtonbee Campus. #### **Dual Credit (SCWI)**

We have students who take Co-op and then take a credit once a week for 15 weeks at one of the following colleges: Seneca (Markham, Newnham, King, Jane or York Campus), George Brown, Centennial, or Georgian. Students receive two credits: one college course credit (from the college) and one BSS elective credit. There is no tuition cost for this program. Books and transportation are included.
