FROM THE OFFICE

We are now starting our fifth week of school for the 2022-23 school year! In an effort to help parents/guardians and students monitor their progress in each of their courses, Interim Reports are being created and will be emailed home on **October 19, 2022**. The Interim Reports are a snapshot of how your child is doing in the first few weeks of school and should be used to have conversations with your son or daughter on their current progress towards their academic goals. The Interim Report has six levels, they are: **Level 4** - a mark above 80%


Level 3 - a mark between 70 - 79 % (meeting the Provincial standard)
Level 2 - a mark between 60 - 69 % (approaching the Provincial standard)
Level 1 - a mark between 50- 59 % (below Provincial standard)
Level "R" - a mark below 50% (currently not passing course)
Level "I" - insufficient information to determine a mark

Each student had the ability to be successful in each of the courses this year. There are many supports along with the classroom teacher who are able to help improve your son or daughter's achievement. We have peer tutoring, numeracy and literacy support, extra help offered during lunches and other supports. Thank you for speaking to your child about their goals and working collaboratively with the school to help them get there.
