RELAY FOR LIFE - JUNE 10 - Request from the Committee

As you may or may not be aware, this year will mark our 10th official Relay for Life.

To date, we have raised over \$200,000.00 in support of the Canadian Cancer Society and have a new group of dedicated students working very hard to spread awareness and promote the impact that the Canadian Cancer Society has in battling all forms of cancer, so that one day we might be able to live in a world free of cancer.

Tragically, cancer remains the leading cause of death in Canada. An estimated 2 in 5 Canadians will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime and about 1 in 4 will die from cancer.

The relay for life event is a very long, but fun, day for staff and students to come together to celebrate the efforts of everyone involved in this global battle against cancer and to show support for those who have been affected.

To this end, **we are reaching out to seek your support with this year's event**. During the day, students (minimum of 1 student per team) walk around a track for the entire duration of the day to signify our solidarity with those who walk this path every single day, in their battle with cancer. However, the most meaningful aspect of the Relay for Life event actually begins just before this as the very first lap of the day is walked by very special, invited guests, who are cancer survivors. These are the guests you see wearing yellow shirts. This is where we are asking for your support at this time. If you are, or know of anyone who is, either in the fight with cancer or a cancer survivor that might be willing to take part in this year's event, please reach out to myself or Nicole Haynes. We are looking to try and have a major presence of cancer survivors this year. These volunteers do not have make any speeches (unless they would like to say something) and are not expected to remain for the entirety of the event. They are free to leave whenever they need to. We just ask that they arrive in time for the opening ceremony and remain to complete the survivor's lap after the ceremony.

Opening ceremonies are scheduled to begin at 10:00am with the survivor's lap beginning shortly after the welcome address (usually around 10:30am)
