Principal's Message

The end of semester 1 and start of semester 2 is an important milestone for 2 groups of students. Our Grade 9s have completed their first semester. For most of our Grade 12 students, semester 2 will be the final semester of high school. The last 3 or 4 courses. These students are setting their sights on the next big adventure – Travel, College, Work, University, all of the above... We have been reminding all of our Grade 12s of the need to "Finish Strong!" Course Selection

Course selection for the 2018-2019 school year has begun. Students select their courses using *Career Cruising*. Students can begin locking in their course selection on February 7. Deadline to submit and hand in the signed copy to your homeroom teacher is **Thursday, February 15**. Grade 12s must complete the course selection and indicate if they are returning or graduating. Students who need support in completing their course selection can come to Guidance.

Community Involvement

Students are encouraged to continue to work on their 40 hours of community involvement. Information regarding volunteer opportunities have been sent to students' GAPPS e-mail, posted in guidance, and tweeted @BayviewGuidance. It is important for students to get their community involvement form pre-approved to ensure the placement is a non-profit organization.

Graduation Assembly

On February 12, there will be an assembly for students who are graduating. Students will learn about graduation awards, gowns, location and time of graduation. In order to participate in graduation, students must pay for graduation no later than February 26.

College Degree Panel

Grade 10 students will learn about degree programs that are offered through Ontario Colleges on March 22, during period 5 in the cafeteria. Many of the programs are highly competitive especially in the fields of animation, aviation, nursing, and graphic design. Students will learn about the university level prerequisite courses they will need in their senior high school years in order to apply to these programs.

International Baccalaureate

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

Education Quality and Accountability Office

E AO Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

What is the OSSLT?

The OSSLT measures whether or not students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Who writes the test?

Students will receive a letter notifying them that they are to write the test by the end of February.

When is the test? This year the test is on Tuesday, April 10, 2018. All students in the province of Ontario write on the same day.
