School Council – A Glance of the 2020/21 School Year

It's hard to believe that the 2020-2021 school year is coming to an end. On behalf of Bayview School Council, we would like to thank you for your support to the school council activities in the past year. With your participation, we were able to run 5 monthly Parent Support Group gatherings. Topics like "Work & Life Balance", "Managing Expectations", and "Dating" were discussed. In total, 60 parents participated in one of these support groups. We would like to thank our Parent Support Group chair, Jennifer Hsieh-Chung, for her coordination and management. We also thank all the group leaders who made time to lead groups in English, Cantonese, Farsi, and Mandarin.

Many thanks also to our Engagement Chair, Lida Moradkhani, for organizing two seminars. One in March on "Mental Health and Substance Abuse" and another one in June on "Communicating with Teens." Both workshops were attended by about 20 parents.

In addition to the above parent engagement activities, the school council received donations from generous parents to support school activities and well-being - \$4500 were approved in the council budget to support the school in purchasing a wireless document camera for Geography department, courtyard furniture, plants and planters, healthy breakfast for 2021/22 fall term and special round tables for the reading program. This year, we have also increased the scholarship amount to the top three Grade 12 students and ordered souvenirs for all graduates. A special thanks to our Ward 3 City Councilor, Castro Liu. Even though there was no Ward 3 BBQ in June 2020 due to the pandemic, he was able to donate \$5,000 to the school. His annual major financial supports in the past many years are greatly valued and appreciated.
