Dear families,

As we head towards the winter break, we want to thank you for your continued partnership and support as we work together to provide your children with a positive and successful school experience.

It matters to us that every child has access to the learning, environment and support they need to be successful in school. That drives our work every day.

Since the start of the school year, we have:

- Launched the <u>Board of Trustees' Multi-Year Strategic Plan</u>. The plan sets out the priorities that guide our work and was heavily informed by feedback from families, staff, students and community partners.
- **Introduced a <u>Family Dashboard</u>** to give you easier one-stop access to tools and resources that support your child's education.

### Semester 2 Final Exams-IMPORTANT INFORMATION!

All students have received their semester 2 final exam schedule.

#### Exam Dates Please be aware of the following:

- January 22nd: Period 5 Exams
- January 23rd: Period 4 Exams
- January 24th: Period | Exams
- January 27th: Period 2 Exams
- January 28th: Period 3 Exams

Each student has received an exam schedule (see above). Students should check with their teachers to confirm all exam information (e.g. room and room changes, course code), particularly if students are enrolled in any course(s) listed under the "Exams during the exam block with special circumstances".

The room schedule for examinations will be posted each exam day. Students are responsible for arriving at the proper time and place for each examination. Be prepared to enter the examination room at least ten minutes prior to the beginning of the examination.

#### All exams listed above begin at 9:00 a.m.

Students are expected to leave the school quickly and quietly at the end of their exam.

Please review the examination schedule and important information that was sent to your child for all other details.

#### Attendance during exams:

• Students who arrive late for an examination must report to the Main Office attendance secretary immediately.

• Students who are late will ONLY be given the time remaining on the examination in progress. Should a situation arise as a result of an emergency, an administrator may give special consideration for the student to write the exam for the allotted time.

• Students missing an examination due to illness, bereavement or a court appearance must notify the school immediately (905-884-4453). Students must provide verification from the appropriate authority (i.e. illness requires a doctor's note indicating that the student is not able to write the exam on the respective day). Medical notes and other verification must be given to Ms. Cowan (VP) in the Main Office.

• Vacation time, extra curricular activities, employment and appointments must not be planned during the scheduled exam period. All exams must be written at the scheduled time and place.

• Students who are NOT legitimately absent for an examination will be given a mark of zero for the exam portion of the course.

## Schedule Your Portrait Session Online!

#### **General Information**

- Schedule your photo appointment online! You can book an appointment on the dates provided for your school by selecting your school's name in the drop-down menu, and then entering the first and last name that the school has on file for you. (You do not need to enter an 8-digit code.)
- You have the option to prepay your \$35 session fee online. If you have not prepaid online, then your session fee must be paid to your photographer at the time of your photo session. Debit or credit is preferred, but cash and cheques made payable to Lifetouch Canada will also be accepted.
  Photos will be taken on the Gym Stage
- Please arrive 10 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment time!
- NOTE: ONLY GRADUATES PHOTOGRAPHED AT THE SCHOOL ARE GUARANTEED TO BE ON THE COMPOSITE

#### Getting Ready!

- If you are wearing a mask, you will be asked to remove it just prior to the start of your session.
- Hair and makeup must be done before your photo session starts.
- If you are bringing in a prop, please ensure you have it ready at the time of your session.
- Lifetouch will provide the traditional grad gown, hat, tassel and a v-stole in your school colours.
- You are welcome to wear your own dress shirt (of any colour) with or without a tie. Please ensure your tie is pre-tied before your appointment or use a clip-on tie.
- Graduates who prefer to not wear a dress shirt with or without a tie, we suggest wearing a V-neck or scoop neck shirt. Please come prepared for your session already dressed in this attire.

#### **Contemporary Poses**

Contemporary poses can be included in your session. This is of the individual graduate only and is done in casual dress. Your portrait session is about capturing your true personality, so we encourage you to bring in a prop such as a musical instrument, sporting equipment, etc.

\*\*Please note: due to allergies, animals are not permitted during any grad photo sessions\*\*

#### A Word about Your Proofs

Two to three weeks after your photo session, you will receive a set of proofs by Canada Post and an email with a link so you can view your graduation proofs online. Keep in mind that your proofs are not retouched, but your finished portrait order will include basic retouching at no charge to eliminate blemishes & soften lines. Premium retouching is available at an additional cost.
