Remaining Exam Dates Please be aware of the following:

• January 27th: Period 2 Exams

• January 28th: Period 3 Exams

Students are expected to leave the school quickly and quietly at the end of their exam.

Attendance during exams:

- Students who arrive late for an examination must report to the Main Office attendance secretary immediately.
- Students who are late will ONLY be given the time remaining on the examination in progress. Should a situation arise as a result of an emergency, an administrator may give special consideration for the student to write the exam for the allotted time.
- Students missing an examination due to illness, bereavement or a court appearance must notify the school immediately (905-884-4453). Students must provide verification from the appropriate authority (i.e. illness requires a doctor's note indicating that the student is not able to write the exam on the respective day). Medical notes and other verification must be given to Ms. Cowan (VP) in the Main Office.
- Vacation time, extra curricular activities, employment and appointments must not be planned during the scheduled exam period. All exams must be written at the scheduled time and place.
- Students who are NOT legitimately absent for an examination will be given a mark of zero for the exam portion of the course.





Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) Program

The York Region District School Board offers language learning for students in the elementary level (SK to Grade 8) and at the secondary level (Grades 9 to 12).

Elementary

The elementary courses are extra-curricular language learning available for in-person or online classes. Classes are 2.5 hours and run once a week between Tuesday to Friday evenings (6:00 PM to 8:30 PM) or Saturday mornings (9:30 AM to 12:00 PM*).

Online registration opens on **Thursday, May 30, 2024**. To attend the full language program in its entirety, be sure to register by **Monday, September 9, 2024**.
