Ontario Secondary Literacy Test * Rescheduled to May 12th

This year grade 10, 11 and non graduating grade 12 students pursuing an OSSD, need to write the OSSLT. Please note, some students will have the test deferred this year based on English course completion and current ESL/ELD levels.

Student Drop-Off/Pick-Up

Please be reminded that all students are to be dropped off and picked up at the side of the school (along Cassata Avenue - see map below). Please do not drop off/pick up your child at the main entrance to the school (along Bayview Avenue) as this is a bus lane. If you are coming from Bayview Avenue, please drive past the main entrance and drop your child off (or pick them up) at the side of the school (along Cassata Avenue). Also, as our parking spaces are limited, please do not park in a parking spot to drop off/pick up your child. Thank you for your cooperation!



To ensure the safety of our staff, students and families, you **MUST** follow the direction of signage and/or staff directing traffic. Given winter weather conditions and the large piles of snow on property, traffic safety is essential.

What do I do if my child needs to self-isolate?

If your child needs to self-isolate, please send an email to shokofeh.amini@yrdsb.ca and indicate:

- Student's full name
- Student number
- Return to school date
- If you wish to have your child be a temporarily remote learner during their isolation period.

Please have your child reach out to their teachers to request their Google Meet codes if they wish to learn remotely while they are absent. Your child is not permitted to return to in-person learning prior to their return to school date (as indicated in your email).

Benefits of In-Person Learning

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Given the numerous benefits of in-person learning, we are planning for our students to attend school in person, while following all appropriate measures to protect the health and safety of students, staff and families.

Students who attend school in-person benefit from:

- developing social/interpersonal skills
- improving in-person communication skills
- building teamwork skills
- wide range of experiential learning opportunities that support different learning styles
- sharing and playing in person
- · participating in social activities, extracurricular clubs, teams and athletics
- leadership opportunities provided through co-curricular activities
- student leadership and mentorship

Schools will continue to follow York Region Public Health COVID-19 Guidelines to ensure safety measures for in-person learning.

Attendance

As a friendly reminder, a student's attendance is linked to their learning model e.g., if a student is scheduled as an in-person learner, but appears online, they will be marked absent. We are not recommending switching back and forth between learning models at this time i.e., if a student has switched once already this semester, please remain in this learning model moving forward.

Summer School

Guidance Appointments

Guidance appointments can be made on Teach Assist under 'Appointment Bookings'. Book with your alpha counsellor based on your last name. Choose the day you would like to meet by clicking on the calendar. YOU CANNOT BOOK SAME DAY APPOINTMENTS. A confirmation of the appointment will appear as a yellow bar on your Teach Assist account if you follow the steps correctly. If you are a remote learner, you must send a phone number to your counsellor to reach you as appointments are via a phone call. In person students, please come to your appointment. Guidance will not call you out of class. If your teacher needs verification, please show your Teach Assist scheduled appointment.

Transcripts **printed ONCE per week (Fridays)**

Transcripts are an official record of Ontario secondary school credit courses that you have completed. Transcripts do not show courses you are currently enrolled in. Transcripts should only be requested for post-secondary education institutions (outside of Ontario), Canadian citizenship and for scholarships. If you need to request a transcript, please email your guidance counsellor. Transcripts will be printed only once per week, every Friday. Please plan your requests accordingly as we will not be printing them on various days.
