

Financial Support for Parents/Guardians

The government is providing financial support to help parents and guardians with additional costs during the 2020-2021 school year during the second wave of COVID-19.

Eligible parents or guardians will receive a one-time payment of:

- \$200 for each child up to age 12
- \$250 for each child or youth up to age 21 years with special needs

This is a new program, and all parents or guardians who are residents of Ontario with eligible children will need to submit a new application for each child.

Celebrations in December

As we honour our school communities that continue to reflect the broader Canadian society, we will continue to educate our students, staff and parents/guardians about significant faith days and celebrations throughout the school year. In particular, we wish to acknowledge and reflect on our understanding of the many holidays and celebrations of several faith groups that occur in our schools and workplaces during the month of December.

For the remaining month, the following will be celebrated:

December 16 Las Posadas

One of the most popular Christmas traditions in Mexico is Las Posadas (Spanish for 'lodging' or 'accommodation'), a nine day celebration/observance beginning December 16 and ending on December 24. The ritual has been a tradition in Mexico for over 400 years.

Judaism

December 18 Last day of Hanukkah

Hanukkah (December 11 - 18), the Festival of Lights (and the Feast of Dedication), commemorates the victory of Judah the Maccabee and religious freedom, and the re-dedication of the Temple in 165 BCE. It also celebrates the power of God and the faithfulness of Israel.

December 21 Pancha Ganapati

(December 21 – 25) Pancha Ganapati is a modern Hindu festival held over five days in honor of Lord Ganesha, Patron of Arts and Guardian of Culture.

Wicca

December 21 Yule

This day, which marks the New Year in the Anglo-Saxon and northern traditions of Wicca, is the celebration of the birth of the God as the Winter-born King, symbolized by the rebirth of the life-generating and life-sustaining sun. It is a time for ritually shedding the impurities of the past year, and for contemplating avenues of spiritual development in the year ahead.

Shinto

December 21 Tohji-taisai

The Grand Ceremony of the December (Winter) Solstice celebrates the joy of the ending of the yin period of the sun, when it declines in strength, and the beginning of its growing power or yang period. The sun is of central importance in Japan, expressing the presence of Amaterasu Omikami, the Kami of the Sun.

Christianity

December 25 Christmas (W, E - New Calendar)

Christmas celebrates the anniversary of the birth of Jesus. A Holy Day of Obligation for Roman Catholics.

Jainism

December 25 Maunajiyaras

(Day of Fasting with Vow of Silence) This is a day of fasting, silence and meditation on the five holy beings: monks, teachers, religious leaders, Arihants (Jinas, enlightened masters) and Siddhas (liberated souls).

December 26 Kwanzaa

Kwanzaa (December 26 - January 1) is celebrated by many North Americans of West African descent in recognition of their African heritage. The candles of a seven-branched candelabrum representing attributes such as unity, self-determination, responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith, are successively lit over the seven days of the festival.

Zarathushti (Zoroastrianism)

December 26 Anniversary of the Death of Prophet Zarathustra

The anniversary of the death of Zarathustra (Zoroaster), the founder of the Zoroastrian faith. His dates are uncertain: the ancient Greeks dated him at ca. 6000 BCE. Modern scholarship suggests he lived in the second millennium BCE. Some of his hymns, known as Gathas, are preserved in the Zoroastrian scriptures.

December 29 Sanghamitta Day

Anniversary of the arrival of Sanghamitta, daughter of King Asoka, who started the Order of Nuns in Sri Lanka and brought a branch of the Bodhi Tree (which still survives in the ancient capital of Anuradhapura). (Theravāda) (Sri Lanka)

Bahá'í Faith December 30 Sharaf Sharaf (Honour) is the 16th month of the Bahá'í year.

Zarathushti (Zoroastrianism)

December 31 Ghambar Maidyarem begins

This period (December 31 - January 4) celebrates the creation of animals. It is also the time for equitable sharing of food.

Registration for Night School eLearning opens December 7.

- Applicants who are enrolled in less than 4 credits in a semester at the day school, may be eligible to take Night School e-Learning at YRDSB.
- Check with your Guidance Counselor before applying.
- Note: Night School e-Learning + Day School credits cannot exceed a total of 8 credits in a school year.

Graduating Students

Students applying to both university and college, please review your courses and grades on OUAC or OCAS. If you find an error, please email your alpha counsellor. Reminder, students taking courses in private school, the private school must add the course and grade to your application. Once the course is complete, have the private school send the official report card to <u>iris.chen@yrdsb.ca</u>.

Students applying to college, make sure you have applied as offerings begin to come out February 1st. The colleges need the time to evaluate your application.
