# Student Drop-Off/Pick-Up

Please be reminded that all students are to be dropped off and picked up at the side of the school (along Cassata Avenue - see map below). Please do not drop off/pick up your child at the main entrance to the school (along Bayview Avenue) as this is a bus lane. If you are coming from Bayview Avenue, please drive past the main entrance and drop your child off (or pick them up) at the side of the school (along Cassata Avenue). Also, as our parking spaces are limited, please do not park in a parking spot to drop off/pick up your child. Thank you for your cooperation!



To ensure the safety of our staff, students and families, you **MUST** follow the direction of signage and/or staff directing traffic. Given winter weather conditions and the large piles of snow on property, traffic safety is essential.

#### **COVID Screening**

#### What do I do if my child needs to self-isolate?

If your child needs to self-isolate, please send an email to shokofeh.amini@yrdsb.ca and indicate:

- Student's full name
- Student number
- Return to school date
- If you wish to have your child be a temporarily remote learner during their isolation period.

Please be reminded that your child is not permitted to return to in-person learning prior to their return to school date (as indicated in your email).

Please continue to complete the COVID-19 screening form (secondary) daily before your child attends school. Thank you again for helping keep our schools safe and open to in-person learning by screening your child/ren and encouraging them to follow the COVID-19 protocols. We remain committed to supporting students and families as we continue to navigate the effects of the pandemic on student learning.

#### **Graduation Ceremonies**

We are pleased to share with you that we will be holding in-person graduation ceremonies in June 2022. This decision was made in consultation with York Region Public Health. We recognize how important graduation ceremonies are for our students and their families, as we look forward to celebrating this exciting and important milestone. At the same time, we will continue to work with public health and prioritize the health and safety of our students, staff and families in our planning. We appreciate that you may have many questions about the graduation ceremonies. We will continue to share information and updates with you as guidance is provided by the Ministry of Education and York Region Public Health.

#### Attendance

As a friendly reminder, a student's attendance is linked to their learning model e.g., if a student is scheduled as an in-person learner, but appears online, they will be marked absent. Learning model changes take at least a full school day to take effect. We are not recommending switching back and forth between learning models at this time i.e., if a student has switched once already this semester, please remain in this learning model moving forward.

Students are expected to be in their Homeroom classes at 8:55. If you are driving your child to school, please ensure that enough time is available for them to access the school and get to class at 8:55.

# Volunteer Opportunity

The Conservation Youth Corps has a virtual volunteer program from May 3-30, 2022 students can complete virtual modules and at-home action projects on biodiversity, invasive species, microplastics, pollinators and habitats.

- The five self-paced modules all include a pre-recorded video, a knowledge testing quiz and an action project that can be completed in a yard or local neighbourhood!
- There will be 3 one-hour orientation sessions and students **must attend one** session in order to participate in the program.
- Students can complete anywhere from 1-5 modules and can earn up to **11 hours of community service** (one hour for the orientation session and two hours for each module).
