### Bullying Prevention and Awareness Week

From November 22-26 we recognize Bullying Prevention and Awareness Week. At our school, it is important that we provide a caring, safe and inclusive environment that supports the academic achievement and well-being of all students. This week serves as a reminder to our school community about bullying and how to respond. During this week students will engage in learning activities that reinforce positive behaviours that respond to and prevent bullying.

Bullying is a form of repeated, persistent and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.

Bullying can take many forms. Some include:

**Physical** – hitting, shoving, stealing or damaging property

**Verbal** – name calling, mocking, or making sexist, racist or homophobic comments

**Social** – excluding others from a group or spreading gossip or rumours about them

**Electronic** (commonly known as cyberbullying) – spreading rumours and hurtful comments through the use of cellphones, e-mail, text messaging and through social media

Bullying is never acceptable at our school. All members of our school community are encouraged to stand up and support each other. Should there be concerns about bullying or if you have any questions please contact us.

You can also report events that happen at school, at school-related activities, online or off school property if they negatively affect a student or the school climate through [YRDSB's Report It tool](#). ## OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. Once the upload is complete you may receive a notification. It is important to review your courses and marks. If you notice an error, please book an appointment with your guidance counsellor. If you are currently taking a Private School courses or a course outside of YRDSB it is up to that school to submit your midterm mark. Once the Private School course is complete the school must email the official report card to [iris.chen@yrdsb.ca](mailto:iris.chen@yrdsb.ca).

## Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses for Graduating Students

For 2021/2022, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) has been changed as per the direction of the Ministry of Education and YRDSB. The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is now December 10, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 10, 2021 then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. A change will have to be made manually to the student's records by their guidance counsellor as the date for uploading marks to OUAC and OCAS will have passed. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

## How do offers of admission work for Ontario Colleges and Universities?

Students can apply NOW to both Ontario colleges and universities. Offers of admission vary depending on the competitiveness of the program and will continue on a rolling basis. Every time marks are submitted, post-secondary institutions review your application. They don't look at your application only once. Ontario has rolling acceptances.

Students applying to college, it is IMPORTANT to apply now especially with competitive programs where spots may fill up by February 1. Students applying to both colleges and universities, it is important to make an account with the schools and to constantly check your personal emails for information from the post-secondary institutions.
