Applying to Post-Secondary Institutions

Students applying to Ontario universities will receive a PIN at the end of October. During this time, it is important to begin your research by visiting <u>OUinfo</u>. A list of campus open houses and tours was sent in the Oct. 2 Guidance Message. In our next Guidance message, there will be a link to our presentation on how to apply to Ontario universities.

Students applying to Ontario colleges <u>do not</u> need a PIN and can apply directly on the Ontario Colleges website. Visit the <u>website</u> to start your research and we highly recommend you begin applying in November. A list of campus open houses and tours was sent in the Oct. 2 Guidance Message. In our next Guidance message, there will be a link to our presentation on how to apply to Ontario colleges.

Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

The Ministry has indicated that, for the 2020-21 school year, course withdrawal dates should be determined based on the completion of approximately 75% of the total course hours. The full disclosure date for grade 11 and grade 12 courses is December 16, 2020. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 16, 2020, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after December 16, 2020, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript. Keep in mind, students need to have 23 **COMPLETED** credits and 4 YRDSB credits this semester to be eligible to drop a course.

OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 20, 2020. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher on November 12, 2020. <u>Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates.</u> Guidance appointments can be booked through Teach Assist.

- November 12Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12
courses.
- November 12 19Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop
a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised
to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.

November 20School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to
OUAC and OCASDecember 16This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12
course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student
Transcript.
