- a. Welcome / Overview presentation by Arlene Higgins-Wright. Principal Arlene Higgins-Wright mentioned that she was so happy to greet students every morning. The interactive relationship is very important to everyone.

- e. Ms. Irvine showed the school activity of Sep. 30<sup>th</sup>, a day for truth and reconciliation. The student equity team and teacher advisors shared daily announcements and songs outlining the importance of learning about the history of residential schools and its negative impacts on Indigenous children and culture.

- i. Grade 12 History students supported by their teachers created a 7-minute video to be shared in all homeroom classes to frame the importance of the day.
- ii. Students and teachers participated in YRDSB wide broadcast in honor of Truth and Reconciliation Day.
- iii. Students made 1,200 "Every child Matters" buttons which were given to students when they arrived at school.

#### f. Events & Activities

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test.

- i. 2 administrations, Fall and Spring
- ii. Grade 11 and 12 (non-graduating) will write the test online in the fall between October 12 and December 01. Test is waived for graduating Grade 12 students.
- iii. Remote learners will be asked to attain the school in person for the test.

Q: Hanna Ha asked who could connect to understand the new model.

Answered by Principal Higgins-Wright: "Me and vice-principals." (She posted the email addresses in the chat window.)

Q: Sharon Wang expressed concerns on the approaching winter weather and the impact on students who stay at school during lunch hour.

A:(Answered by Principal Higgins-Wright) The school has already started preparing for this. Has considered the weather, like moving to different spaces, etc.

Mr. Ishiguro also commented: "We have taken measures to prepare for cold weather, with regards to lunch e.g., designating eating areas in the hallways and limiting to groups of four per lunch."

Q: Vivian Tu asked about the LEAPP program.

Mr. Ishiguro answered it's a year-long volunteer program.

Student rep William pasted in the chat window:

"I'm a LEAPP mentor and I strongly recommend you encourage your kids to check out the fun events/initiatives LEAPP has in store :)

You can have your child email me and I can have them assigned to a mentor asap."

Q: Qusai Kanchwala asked whether the parent night could be in person.

Answered by Principal Higgins-Wright: York Region Public Health doesn't approve large gatherings-it must be online (this year).

Q: Jennifer Hsieh-Chung asked whether the student council could provide an orientation for Grade 10 students, who were at virtual school last year.

Answered by Ms. Sadacharan, we already had a mentorship and provided the orientation for the grade 9 students.

Q: Nancy shared her concern about no French teacher for Grade 9 students.

Ms. Irvine responded that the school had a shortage. It's difficult to hire, not enough applicants. There is a temporary teacher next week in school.

### 8. Financial Report

Rev. Philip Der presented the report. The school account currently shows \$6049.92; however, \$5775.20 of that amount has been budgeted and approved for expenses from the last school year.

Once all accounts payable have been paid, the remaining balance will be \$274.72. Rev. Philip Der mentioned ways to fundraise and encourage parents to donate. Phillip mentioned that parents could make a donation through Cash Online; but this medium only raises a minimal amount. Need to communicate fundraising goals/objectives in order to better engage with the parent community to drive donations.
