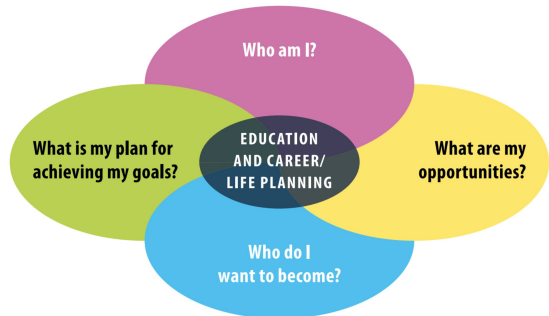


# GETTING STARTED WITH MY PATHWAY PLANNER

To open “My Pathway Planner”, go to the public page of the YRDSB site and click on the icon. Alternatively you can type the following URL in your web browser:

<https://mypathwayplanner.yrdsb.ca>

By the end of November, you will be able to access this log-in page on your school’s website.

Once the single sign-on page has opened, log in using your student number and YRDSB password. Be sure to select EDU as the domain. After successfully logging in, you will be redirected to your Individual Pathway Planner (IPP).

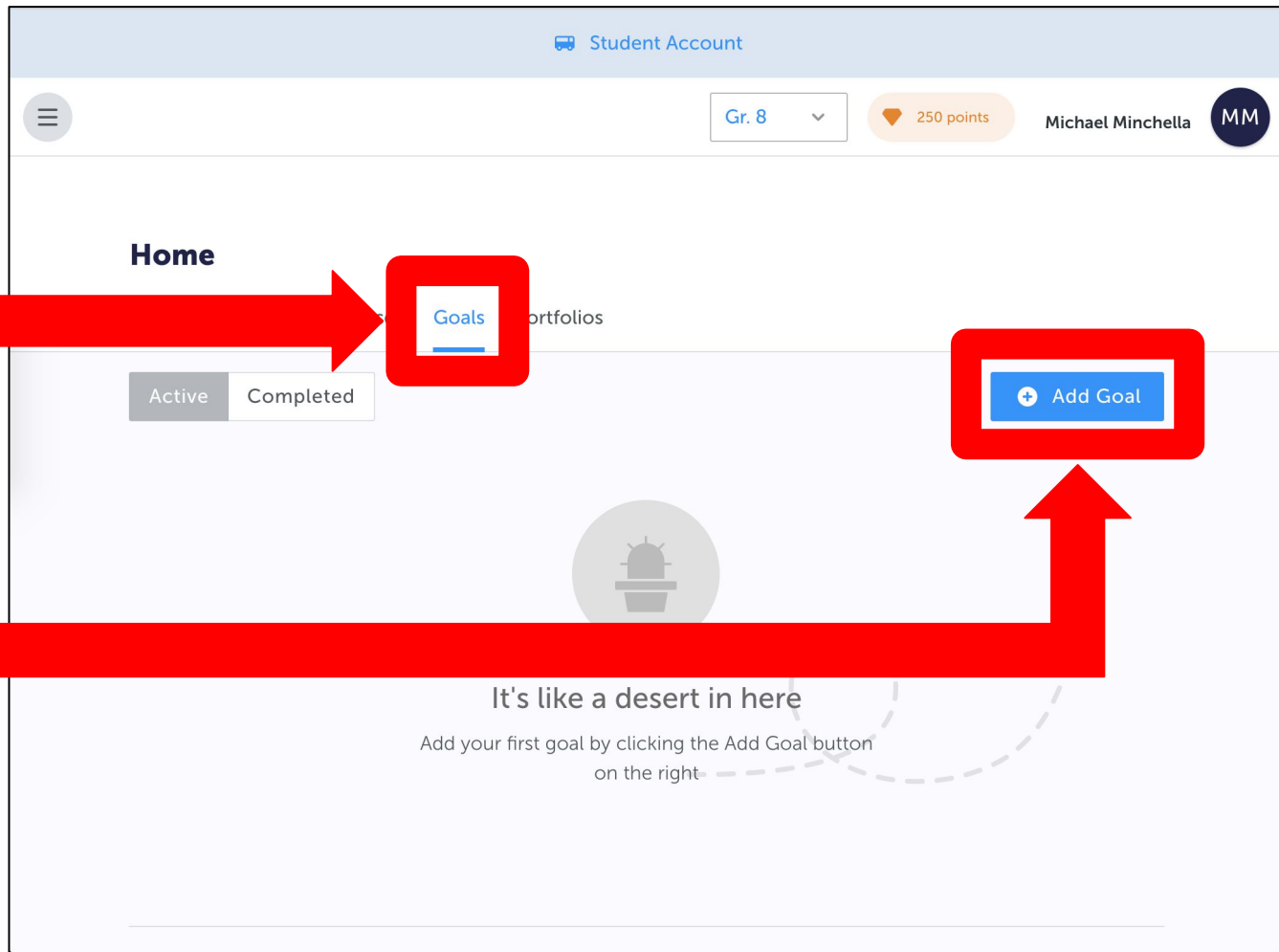
